Our Ministries.

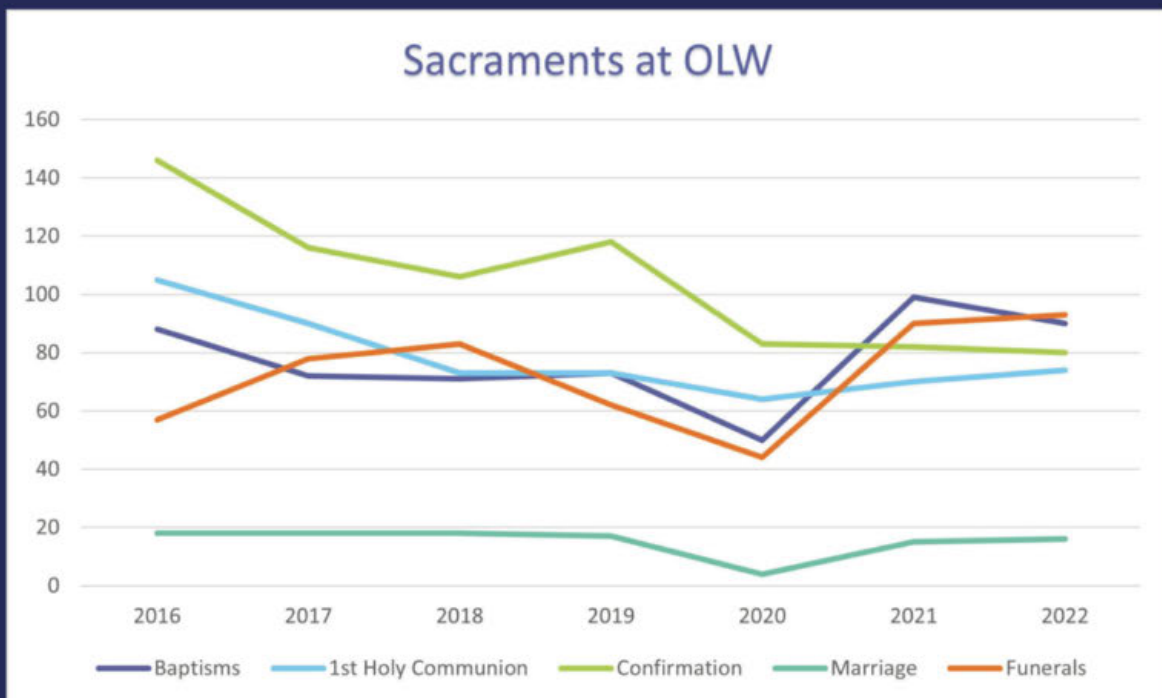
One of the proudest honors we have as a Parish is to celebrate sacraments with our parishioners in every phase of their lives.

FY22 saw a 4% increase in Sunday and Holy Day Offertory, however, **our collections did not, and still have not, returned to pre-COVID levels, but our worship and parish expenses have.** Fiscal year 2021-2022 ended with a \$61,829 deficit due to the increase in expenses. **This creates a need to ask parishioners to prayerfully consider increasing their weekly donations.**

Sacrament and Mass intention donations increased 50% when restrictions began to lift and our parishioners were able to resume planning their weddings, baptisms, and funerals.

Tuition & Fees and Fundraising amounts have significant changes due to allocating around \$40k from Fundraising to Fees. In the past, family fees were allocated into Fundraising, which is now corrected and allocated into the Tuition & Fees account.

Parish Operations and Financial Highlights, Continued:

- We built a relationship with Galileo Camps which now generates rental income from our facilities in the summer.
- In addition, we were blessed by a few very generous donors who contributed to the school operational budget and to special parish projects. Thank you for your continuous support!
- Operating & Office Expenses grew due to increased parish activity, as ministries revived and general support expenses resumed. Parishioners returned to Mass in our Church which increased liturgical costs. Ministries ramped up, and in-person meetings and social events resumed. A 20% increase in property casualty insurance and an increase in books and supply orders were major contributing factors to the overall 14% increase.
- Furnishings & Other Equipment significantly decreased when compared to FY21. Capital expenditures were lower as those expenses were completed the prior year.
- **Overall, we were able to decrease our deficit when compared to FY21.** Thankfully, the PPP loans that the parish and school received provided a cushion and we were able to cover our deficit without decreasing our parish savings. These funds will continue to help us operate during the current year.
- Our parish believes in a strong, viable Catholic School and Religious Education Program which **teaches hundreds of children year after year** and provides a strong foundation of Catholic values and beliefs. **We continue to strongly support the school with capital improvements, financial investments and administration by working closely with the various boards and associations. Our School is the largest ministry of OLV Parish.**

While Our Lady of the Wayside's two largest events (Raffle and Annual Gala) provide considerable revenue to the Parish and School, OLW parishioners give much of themselves as well.

For example,

- The St. Mark's Ministry sponsors a monthly food drive, the second Sunday of every month, to benefit the Food Pantry at our sharing parish. We routinely deliver six SUV's filled with food to St. Mark's each month.
- The St Vincent DePaul Ministry hosts an annual 5K Run & Walk to promote community and raise funds for those in need of life's basic necessities.

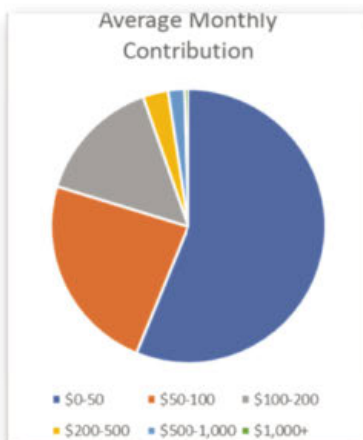

Online Giving

Many parishioners have registered for automated, online giving through **GiveCentral**. Making regularly scheduled contributions is similar to how many pay household bills online.

GiveCentral allows you to easily contribute using a bank account, credit card or debit card. You can automate the frequency of your offertory contributions – weekly or monthly – and you can adjust your contributions as needed.

You can also set up donations for second collections, holidays and other giving opportunities, such as the School Endowment Fund, Rebek Scholarship Fund, Parish capital improvements, or to a General Fund to help balance the budget.

The **benefit of online giving to YOU** is that you know you are consistently supporting the parish, even on the weeks you can't make it to Mass at OLW.

The **benefit to the parish** is the ease of receiving your contribution and the predictability of cash flow.

For almost 70 years, Our Lady of the Wayside School has provided students with an academically excellent education grounded in Catholic faith formation. OLV partners with its families to achieve the mission of enriching minds, fostering faith and expanding talents for each and every student. In turn, the school contributes to the vibrancy of Our Lady of the Wayside parish as students and their families support and participate in many aspects of parish community life.



School families value the Catholic education that our school provides; they appreciate the small class size, caring teachers and welcoming parent community.

The benefits and impact of receiving a faith-based, academically-rich education extends well beyond the hallways of Wayside. OLV alumni consistently excel both inside and outside the classroom — in high school and beyond — and continue the OLV tradition of serving others through a commitment to community service. Today's Wayside student becomes tomorrow's leader in faith, academics and service to others.

Our Lady of the Wayside School Funds.

Our school is the largest ministry of the parish. Families pay tuition and fees, but these do not cover the actual cost of educating an OLW student. The Parish's investment in the school allows it to set competitive and reasonable tuition rates.

In addition to the investment from the parish, the school relies on fundraising efforts and donations from current and former parents, alumni, parishioners, family and friends, and community partners.

The **Annual Fund** is an unrestricted fund that supports the school in its immediate needs. This includes the school counselor, curriculum coordinator, teacher stipends & reimbursements for classroom supplies, and student activities and club fees. Fundraising by our Family School Association (FSA) contributes to this fund, and the school relies on an annual contribution of over \$130,000 to ensure the above programs are always present.

Other fundraising for the Annual Fund comes from our Annual Alumni appeal, #GivingTuesday, matching donations, and from directed donations throughout the year.

Established in 1999, our **Endowment Fund** perpetuates, partially supports, and upholds the educational work of the School. Many alumni parents support the Endowment Fund because they understand the long-term benefits of securing OLW's future. This is a restricted fund, and only interest income can be used. Recently, the Endowment Fund disbursed funds to buy 11 SMARTBoards and to support 5 students on scholarship.

The **Gloria Rebek Scholarship Fund** assists families who require immediate or ongoing tuition assistance. You can support the Rebek Fund during two specific second collections, by making ongoing donations through GiveCentral, or by designating your donation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

January 22, 2023

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was a young seminarian, I asked a wise old priest how to pray better. He said simply, "Don't lie when you pray." He helped me to see how much energy I waste in trying to appear acceptable to God when I pray. For me, prayer was showing off for God and hiding what was ugly.

It's stunning that the Gospel of Matthew tells us of Jesus, "**He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulon and Naphtali...**" This isn't just the Lord's relocation up north. It's his moving into places of shame and defeat. This region was where the enemy invasion of Israel began centuries before. Jesus left the comfortable confines of Nazareth and sought out a place of darkness, not to bring shame, but to announce the dawning of his light.

When we pray, we usually prefer Jesus to stay put in our little Nazareths — where we feel comfortable, successful, and in control. But he moves. He re-locates into the Zebulons and Naphtalis of our shame, embarrassment, fear, and sense of being defeated. The question for us is: will we allow him to take up residence in those places in our prayer time? Will we talk to him honestly about our places of darkness? If we do, we're no longer lying when we pray.

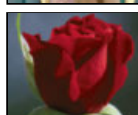
