

Third Sunday of Easter - Year A

God Loves us, and His Love is eternal. God gives us, mortal human beings, the gift of immortality. This is the reason why we should be full of joy during this time of Easter. It is true that we experience many difficulties, times of darkness, and uncertainty in our lives. Yet, today's gospel is an invitation to meet with the

risen Lord, even in our difficulties,

Just as the disciples were on their way to Emmaus and just as they encountered Jesus, we are also on the way—the path to Heaven. As we follow the path, we, too, encounter Jesus in other people, in prayer, in the Scriptures, and—most miraculously—in the Holy Eucharist. At every Holy Mass, we (like the Apostles) recognize Jesus after He rose from the dead in the breaking of the bread:

"And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him."

Today we partake of the same Eucharist as the Apostles. We receive the very same Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord. But do we recognize Him? Do we believe?

Today's Gospel comes to life in our lives during this and every celebration of the Eucharist. In the same way that Jesus met with his Apostles after His resurrection He comes to us. Therefore, He is truly alive! He is with us. This is the reality that we as Catholics profess to believe. So, let us be people of hope and love. During this season of Easter, I would like to invite you to open your hearts to Jesus, so that He may give you true joy. I pray that one day, like King David, we all may pray: "My heart has been glad and my tongue has exulted; my flesh, too, dwells in hope, because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld."


An overview of SAB's roles and responsibilities can be found on the school's website, under the Parents tab.

THE ART OF DYING WELL



Prioritizing your health after a job layoff

Three years after the COVID pandemic disrupted the United States workforce, some employees are experiencing a new wave of turmoil – layoffs. Big tech companies announced thousands of layoffs in recent weeks and months, citing uncertain economic conditions. It's a sudden life change that many employees didn't see coming.

"A person's response to an unexpected job loss might depend on personality, finances and career situation," says Dr. Thomas Harrington, family medicine physician at Aurora Health Center in West Allis, Wis. Although everyone responds to job loss differently, it's common for some to feel increased levels of stress or struggle with a sense of identity,

impacted daily routine and feelings of isolation. Dr. Harrington has advice on how to manage mental and physical health after a layoff.

Identifying and managing stress

Applying and interviewing for new positions, filing for unemployment and searching for health insurance can be stressful and overwhelming for job seekers. According to Dr. Harrington, the effects of stress are dependent upon the duration of stress. Acute stress, which lasts a couple of hours, can raise a person's blood pressure, heart rate and blood sugar. In turn, these can create short-term physical tension and mental strain. Chronic stress, on the other hand, has more nega-



tive consequences and can lead to everything from heart disease and obesity to depression and panic disorders.

"It's important to develop techniques or skills that can be used while feeling stressed," says Dr. Harrington. "These include breathing techniques, meditation, walking, exercising, drawing, painting or listening to music." Taking a step back and identifying sources of stress is also important. Dr. Harrington suggests working to eliminate sources of stress through rearrangement and reprioritization. "If a person is let go from a job that has been a source of negative and chronic stress, taking some time to reflect, process and plan a new path might be a great idea," says Dr. Harrington.

Workplace identity and routines

In the United States, most full-time employees work 40 hours (about 1 and a half days) a week. With that time commitment, personal identity and workplace identity can easily intertwine, and it may feel complicated to untangle those identities after a layoff. "Losing a job could create an identity crisis if that identity is centered around a single role," warns Dr. Harrington. "Reviewing the other roles in our lives, such as partner, parent, friend or coach can remind us we are much more than the job we do or the career we have."

A sudden shift in daily routine may also be hard to navigate. "Sometimes a break from daily routines is an opportunity to review values and priorities and create a new daily routine," says Dr. Harrington. "Before feeling the need to jump right back into a routine, take an inventory of your life and ensure you are going back to what matters most."

Feelings of isolation

Isolation has been associated with insomnia, anxiety, depression and suicide. Losing a job can cause some to feel shame, which can lead to isolation. If someone begins to feel isolated or notices a change in sleeping or eating habits, Dr. Harrington recommends taking the simple step of reaching out to a close friend or relative to meet for coffee or lunch. "It's always a good idea to find and seek out a coach, therapist, primary care provider or somebody who can help them navigate health concerns or conditions," says Dr. Harrington.

Along with lifelong co-worker Dolores Huerta, Chavez brought national attention to an abused yet fundamental part of our work force. On this anniversary of her passing, let her words infuse your own everyday spirituality: "Holiness comes wrapped in the ordinary. There are burning bushes all around you. Every tree is full of angels. Hidden beauty is waiting in every crumb. . . . Real Presence is everywhere, and those with the hearts of children revel in it."

Mark left his mark

Mark wasn't a direct disciple of Jesus but was quite active in the Early Church. He was closest to Peter, the latter returning to Mark's mother's house after escaping prison. According to Saint Jerome: "Mark, the disciple and interpreter of Peter, wrote a short gospel at the request of the brethren at Rome embodying what he had heard Peter tell. When Peter had heard this, he approved it and published it to the churches to be read by his authority." Mark's short, action-packed gospel highlights the immediacy of Jesus' actions; Mark also uses the word *eutheos*—Greek for "right away"—more than 40 times. How might the Spirit be tapping you to act with immediacy?

The Catholic Church teaches that the "Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." As such, it is essential to feeding our spirit and showing us the way to holiness. The very act of listening to the Word, sharing our gifts, and breaking bread with others during Mass is a foretaste of God's reign, where all are welcome to the table. A U.S. Bishops-sponsored Eucharistic Revival is underway to encourage all to encounter Christ in the Eucharist

The real deal

Today's gospel has a eucharistic theme, with talk of "living bread" and "flesh for the life of the world." One way the church emphasizes the Eucharist is its insistence on the Real Presence, that is, the core belief that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. They are not just symbols but, as Saint John Damascene wrote, the "actual deified body of the Lord." If wrestling with that concept makes your head hurt, know that the church also acknowledges this is a "mystery"—something the mind cannot fully grasp. Leave it to the heart to understand.

Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort, known for his love of the Rosary, always made sure to teach people to pray the Rosary in whatever method best helps them enter into the mysteries of the life of Christ. I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus always has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead.


