The Holy Spirit Is alive at OLW

"He is Risen"

Several weeks back, on Easter Sunday, those words resonated in our readings, as the apostles heard the message of Jesus rising from the dead. At first, it was difficult for them to understand, but over the next few weeks, with guidance from Jesus, they came to understand His message.

As His time of a bodily presence on earth was coming to an end, Jesus told the apostles that they would have to continue to bring God's message to the world. The apostles were afraid and didn't know how they could do that. Jesus said, "I will send the *Holy Spirit* to strengthen and guide you." That message was meant for the apostles and *all future* generations of believers.

The power of the *Holy Spirit* is thriving at Our Lady of the Wayside. There are many ministries that show the presence of God in OLW's parish life. This week I would like to focus on the St. Mark's Food Pantry ministry. The food pantry is a long-standing OLW ministry, dating back to the 1990's. Don Piergalski has coordinated the project for over five years. During this time the donations have doubled, reflecting OLW's commitment to help the St. Mark's community during these very challenging times.

On the second Sunday of every month the ministry collects food donated by parishioners and neighbors. The food is stored in plastic bins on shelves in the garage. Then, on the following Saturday a volunteer team loads their cars and vans with the food and drives down to the St. Mark Food Pantry. There they unload their cars and vans and the St. Mark's crew loads the food onto their pantry shelves.

The team loads 7 vans of much-needed non-perishable food.



The volunteer drivers arrive back at OLW at 11a.m. Some donors who were unable to shop for food, have donated checks payable to OLW - St. Mark's Food Pantry. This also is an excellent opportunity to share in this effort; the money is used to buy perishable items at discounted prices from the Chicago Food Depository.

QUEEN OF HEAVEN AND EARTH

5th Sunday of Easter - Year A

In today's Gospel, we hear about how the Blessed Mother hurried to her cousin Elizabeth when she learned from the Angel Gabriel that Elizabeth was six months pregnant. Upon Mary's arrival, Elizabeth exclaimed: "And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" As we all know: Jesus is the

Lord of both Heaven and Earth. When Elizabeth called Mary the "Mother of my Lord," Elizabeth proclaims that Mary is the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Unlike other queens, however, Mary never lived in a castle nor was she served by servants and dressed by handmaids. Instead, the Blessed Mother was Herself a servant. In the same Gospel of St. Luke, but just before the passage that I read today, Mary tells the Angel Gabriel: "I am the handmaid of the Lord." We see this very clearly in today's Gospel when Mary, pregnant with Jesus and already a queen because of this, hurries to St. Elizabeth to take care of her during the remainder of Elizabeth's pregnancy. At a time when any other queen would claim that she should be served and taken care of, and at a time when most mothers feel sick in early pregnancy, the Blessed Mother forgets about herself and goes to serve others.

During this month of May, we honor Mary in a special way as our Mother and our Queen.

Mary loves us as Her own children, is closer to us than our natural mothers, and serves us by asking Her Son for all of the graces that we need to become great saints.

In Her tender care, She accompanies, guides, and protects us in every moment of our lives. It is fitting, therefore, that we honor Our Lady in a special way and show our love for Her as the Queen of Heaven and Earth and Our Queen by singing beautiful songs to her and crowning her with beautiful flowers that Her Son Himself created. We are so blessed to have such a beautiful Queen and Spiritual Mother in Heaven




St. Mark's Food Collection: May 14










The last of the seven sacraments we will review is **Holy Orders** - a sacrament of Service. The Sacrament of Holy Orders is the continuation of Jesus Christ's priesthood, which He bestowed upon His Apostles. Therefore, the Catechism of the Catholic Church refers to the Sacrament of Holy Orders as "the sacrament of apostolic ministry."

Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, a baptized man is configured to Christ by the grace of the Holy Spirit through the laying on of hands, becoming an icon of Christ so he can stand in the very Person of Christ among those he serves. The grace of ordination imparts a permanent seal on his soul that conforms him to Christ in a deep way.

"Ordination" comes from the Latin word *ordinatio*, which means to incorporate someone into an order. In the Sacrament of Holy Orders, a man is incorporated into the priesthood of Christ at one of three levels: the episcopate (office of a bishop), the priesthood, or the diaconate.

- **Bishops** receive the fullness of Holy Orders and can trace their ordination in succession all the way back to the Apostles themselves. The importance of this apostolic succession for the preservation of the Church's teaching is clearly documented as early as the second century. Bishops receive the office of Jesus for sanctifying, teaching, and guiding or governing the faithful under their care. They are assigned by the Pope to serve the Church in a particular geographic area called a Diocese or Archdiocese, and they share in the Pope's responsibility for the whole Church as his brothers.
- **Priests** are also ordained into Jesus' ministerial priesthood. They serve as co-workers with their bishops, to whom they promise obedience and by whom they are ordained, and he assigns them to serve the people in a particular parish or ministry and to share in his office of sanctifying, teaching, and governing. As priests, they receive from Christ the power to forgive sins and to celebrate Mass.
- **Deacons** are also ordained by the bishop, but not to the priesthood. A deacon's ministry is one of service, so that bishops and priests may focus primarily on those duties reserved to them. Deacons may assist at the Mass, preach, and teach, witness, and bless marriages, preside at funerals, baptize, and carry out works of charity, but they cannot hear confessions or celebrate Mass.

How does one become ordained?

Priests must undergo a challenging formation program which lasts from five to thirteen years, depending upon his background and the seminary he attends. Seminaries address four types of formation: human, spiritual, academic, and pastoral. In addition to the academic course work, seminarians participate in a full schedule of spiritual activities - Daily Mass, Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, spiritual direction, and retreats. At each level of seminary training, the seminarian prepares for future pastoral ministry in various settings, such as schools, religious education programs, hospitals, prisons, and parishes. All the formation takes into consideration the human person, fostered by community living, workshops and other programs. The formation of future priests also includes practical learning, such as preaching, presiding at Mass and pastoral counseling.

Deacons also undergo a challenging formation period of 3-5 years depending on the Diocese. In the Archdiocese of Chicago, formation is a four-year program. It includes a one-year Aspirancy Path, which concentrates on prayer and discernment, and a three-year Candidate Path, which focuses on academic courses in addition to the formation elements of human, spiritual and pastoral, which lead to Holy Orders.

Holy Orders is a call from God, not to be confused with a career choice or a right that anyone can invoke. Unlike the Sacraments of Initiation, which are intended for everyone in the Church, Holy Orders is a gift given as God wills and the Church confirms. This past weekend we heard stories from our Deacons about how they heard God's call - and for many this call from God lasted decades before it was acted on. I invite you to ask any Priest or Deacon to share their story - it is a powerful witness of how God speaks to us, how we need to listen, and how He does not abandon us even if we are slow to answer His call.

Appointed to the task

We see them in some of our parishes standing near the presider at Mass: men dressed sort of like priests but with a diagonal or odd-looking stole. What are deacons for, we may wonder? Deacons assist priests in visiting the sick and provide service in the parish community. They can preach, witness marriages, perform Baptisms, and preside at funeral services outside of Mass. While they're ordained clergy, they may also be married and serve without pay. The permanent diaconate is a special call for those "filled with the Spirit and wisdom." Know someone who fits this description? Encourage him to apply.

Sanctity can't be rushed

Of the approximately 10,000 canonized saints, there are only 11 from the United States, and only three of those were U.S.-born. Of course, part of the reason is that the United States is a relatively young country. Give it time, Blessed Teresa Demjanovich would likely say, because she believed her calling was to remind everyone that they are called, regardless of vocation, to be a saint. Born in New Jersey in 1901, Demjanovich is one of a growing list of American candidates for sainthood and the first to be beatified on American soil. She was a Sister of Charity for only two years before dying at the age of 26. Take to heart her message that everyone is called to a life of holiness and aspire to join her on that list.

Advantage from adversity

On this day in 328, 30-year-old Saint Athanasius was elected the new bishop of Alexandria. If that seems young, it was. Even though he helped win the day at the Council of Nicea—taking on Arius and others who denied Christ's full divinity—his elevation as bishop instigated years of struggle with political and ecclesial foes. At issue: Athanasius' stubborn refusal to water down anything in the Nicene Creed. Thus, in the 45 years Athanasius served as bishop, he was exiled a total of five times, 17 years in all. May Athanasius provide a lesson for us all about turning adversity into advantage. While in exile, he did much writing—including a definitive biography of Saint Anthony that would influence other future saints, including Augustine.

A mighty pen

On this day in 1990 the famed Southern writer Walker Percy died, one of the clarion voices of reason in the troubled climate of his day. He lived through Jim Crow, being born near the height of it, and wrote with the power of his deep Catholic faith to issues of the day. A graduate of medical school, Percy would in the end become

one who probed minds and hearts with the pen—including his own. He famously said, "A fine writer's thoughtful analysis of his own trials and errors is valuable indeed." May we emulate his admirable introspection.

Rejoice and be glad!

Doesn't everyone seek a bit of joy? Jesus tells his disciples, "Remain in my love ... so that ... your joy may be complete." Our tradition uplifts those who are joyful even amid setbacks. The concept of the Paschal Mystery points to resurrection—joy—hidden in even the darkest times. Pope Francis often encourages church leaders to show some joy, and he reminds the faithful that God "created us because he wants us to be happy." Jesus' first miracle enabled wedding guests to drink wine and celebrate. Does your faith in God bring you joy? Let others see it.

Saint Teresa of Ávila had a deep understanding of the value of friendship, not only with God but with one another. Numerous studies conclude that surrounding yourself with good people boosts self-esteem, helps you bear stress and grief more effectively, encourages healthy behavior, and increases your chances for a longer and happier life. Your time is a valuable—and limited—resource. Surround yourself with friends and associates who will do you good. Then return the favor

Holy East and West

When's the last time you called a priest "Swami" instead of "Father"? If the priest was today's commemorative, Benedictine Father Bede Griffiths, you would be correct using the title. Griffiths (1906-93), a British-born priest, was sent to India in 1955 to establish a Benedictine monastery. There he studied Indian spirituality and incorporated into the monastery cultural elements of a Hindu ashram. He became known to his congregants as Swami Dayananda, a name that means "bliss of compassion." GOSPEL MEDITATION:

MAY 7, 2023 5th Sunday of Easter

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is priesthood.

St. Peter says to us, "You are a 'chosen race, a royal priest-hood..." To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith..
