#### **GOD'S RIGHTS?**

6th Sunday of Easter - Year A

In today's Gospel, Jesus says "If you love me, you will keep My Commandments" (Jn 14:15). For most 'modern' people, the idea of following God's commandments is considered old-fashioned, repressed, and passe; only rigid and closed-minded people keep God's commandments. With all of the narratives we hear on the news

and in different forms of media, we are constantly being told to make sure that everyone respects our rights, our freedom to do whatever we want, our space, etc. But do we ever stop to ask ourselves: What are God's rights? And what is due to Him? He, after all, created us; we would not exist or even have the ability to do or enjoy anything without Him. So what about what Our Loving Creator deserves and is owed by us in gratitude?

The Ten Commandments, the Great Commandment, and all that Jesus teaches us is not only for our own good and well-being, it is for the sake of respecting God's rights as Our Lord and Creator. As Jesus tells us, to follow His Commandments is to love Him.

When we follow the Ten Commandments, we think, say, and do what is owed to God—we show Him that we trust that He loves us and that He knows and wants what is best for us. We give God His due.

So, in a time and world where it is so unfashionable and unwoke to follow the Commandments, let us strive to do what Jesus asks because we trust and believe that God knows better than us. Let us do what He commands as an expression of our love and gratitude. And let us follow His teaching because, if we do so, it rightly orders our lives and properly disposes our hearts and souls to receive the Holy Spirit and all of His astounding gifts—the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, fear of the Lord, peace, faith, hope, and true joy. How desperately we need these gifts in our day and age! And how ready God is to pour them out upon us in abundance!

# WHAT IS MOTHERHOOD

While we seem to always think about motherhood in the physical aspect, there is also an aspect of motherhood called spiritual motherhood.

To understand spiritual motherhood, St John Paul II wrote an apostolic letter in 1988 called Mulieris

Dignitatem (On the Dignity and Vocation of Women)

where he says, The moral and spiritual strength of a woman is joined to her awareness that God entrusts the human being to her in a special way. ... This entrusting concerns women in a special way — precisely by reason of their femininity — and this in a particular way determines their vocation. ... A woman is strong because of her awareness of this entrusting. (30)

This is an important piece to help us open our minds to the idea that motherhood can expand beyond maternity. Spiritual motherhood is the universal vocation for all women and God entrusts them to help care for humanity -- to pray for them, to nurture them, and to be an example to them.

And there is no better example of spiritual motherhood than the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the ultimate mother and as St John Paul II wrote, Mary is the "figure" of the Church: "For in the mystery of the Church, herself rightly called mother and virgin, the Blessed Virgin came first as an eminent and singular exemplar of both virginity and motherhood ... The Son whom she brought forth is He whom God placed as the firstborn among many brethren (cf. Rom 8: 29), namely, among the faithful. In their birth and development, she cooperates with maternal love."

Mary offers maternal comfort to those who are struggling with the virtues of motherhood and is an inspiration to us all. She reminds us of the special bond mothers have with their children and that this incredible bond is truly a gift from God always to be celebrated. Let us look to our heavenly Mother as we move forward in both physical and spiritual motherhood.

## Reduce Your Risk of Leading Women's Health Concerns

You might already know that breast cancer and heart disease are two leading health concerns for women. However, you might not be aware that breast cancer and heart disease share many of the same risk factors. Most of these risk factors are things we are in control of and can change. If we know what to work on, we can reduce the risk for both heart disease and breast cancer, two leading health threats for women.

Shared risk factors for both heart disease and breast cancer:

#### Age

- Both breast cancer and heart disease incidence increase with age, especially after menopause.
- Age at menarche and menopause are risk factors for both heart disease and breast cancer
- Early menarche (<11 years of age) is an increased risk for both coronary heart disease (CHD) and breast cancer.
- Early menopause (<45 years of age) is associated with an increased risk for CHD, but a decreased risk for breast cancer.
- Late menopause (>55 years of age) is associated with a lower risk for heart disease, but an increased risk for breast cancer.

#### Use of combined hormone replacement therapy post-menopause

• Large randomized controlled trials show there may be an increased risk for both breast cancer and heart disease, usually with 5 or more years of use, and isn't recommended for prevention.

#### Inactivity/Sedentary behavior

• Inactivity and high amounts of sedentary behavior increases risk for both breast cancer and heart disease in both pre-and post-menopausal women.

#### Overweight/Obesity

- Carrying excess weight is an independent risk factor for heart disease.
- Excess weight is also a risk factor for breast cancer, but more specifically in post-menopausal women. Weight loss is also more challenging after menopause.

#### **Tobacco Use**

- Cigarette smoking is a major risk factor for heart disease and stroke. The link between smoking and breast cancer is less conclusive, however, several studies show a weak but positive association.
- Studies have also shown an increased risk for breast cancer in women who smoked for long durations and in women who started smoking early in life.

#### Diet pattern

- A Western dietary pattern (high in red meat, processed meats, refined grains added sugars) may increase risk for heart disease by 22%. An eating pattern high in plant-based foods and low in animal foods (think DASH Eating Plan or Mediterranean Diet) has been shown to lower risk for heart disease by up to 30%.
- Many large, observational studies show a 20-30% reduced risk for breast cancer with adherence to a Mediterranean style of eating and an increased risk with an unhealthy eating pattern.

#### Alcohol intake

- Drinking large amounts of alcohol increases the risk for heart disease and is an even bigger risk factor for breast cancer.
- Alcohol is a well-established modifiable risk factor for breast cancer in both pre-and post-menopausal women. Studies show a 5% to 9% increased risk for breast cancer per drink per day.

Ladies, while we cannot stop ourselves from getting older, we can age more gracefully by living a healthy lifestyle. In doing so, this can lower our risk for both breast cancer and heart disease.

#### Don't smoke. If you do smoke, quit.

- Move your body 150 minutes per week or more and reduce sedentary behavior.
- Aim for a healthy weight. Lose weight if needed.
- Follow a dietary pattern high in lots of plant-based foods with fibre.
- Be careful with alcohol. Aim for one drink or less per day.

# FATHER DAN BRADY CELEBRATES MASS & 62 YEARS OF PRIESTHOOD








Father Brady celebrated the 7:30 am Mass last Sunday as well as 62 years of priesthood.

#### What keeps us faithful

Catholics tend to be leery of words like "testimony" and "witness" when it comes to the business of sharing our faith with others. We may prefer to keep our profession of faith in a more formal key: say, with a group recitation of the Apostles' or Nicene Creed. Many of us may feel ill-equipped to give a defense of the faith in the debate style known as apologetics. Yet each of us should be prepared to give the reason for our hope to anyone who asks. What keeps us faithful? And how does what we believe influence who we're becoming?

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 8:5-8, 14-17; 1 Peter 3:15-18; John 14:15-21 (55). "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope."

#### Monday, May 15, 2023

#### A patron of plentitude

Isidore, the patron saint of farmers, was a peasant farm worker in Spain around the year 1100. There's a theme of abundance surrounding the stories of his miracles. It's said that at times, an angel was seen doing his work while he prayed, and other times, two angels worked beside him, increasing his output. He made water burst from dry earth to quench the thirsty, and there was always enough in his wife's pot of stew to feed however many hungry people he brought home. When he fed starving animals from his bag of wheat, the same bag produced double the expected amount of flour. When you work, and when you give from the fruits of your work, do so with a prayerful, plentiful heart and think, there's always more where that came from!

#### Love triumphs

Joan of Arc was canonized on this day in 1920—making her the only person in history ever to be both condemned and canonized by the Catholic Church. Her triumph: leading the French army to victory over the British. Her tragedy: being burned at the stake, the power of her faith mistaken for witchcraft. Joan's resolve caused Mark Twain to insist, "She is easily and by far the most extraordinary person the human race has ever produced." The centennial of her canonization caused Pope Benedict XVI to insist the "name of Jesus invoked by this saint in the last instants of her earthly life was like the continual breath of her soul." She "understood that Love embraces all things." Love like Joan today. EASTER WEEKDAY

#### Wednesday, May 17, 2023

#### Stop the traffic

Saint Josephine Bakhita, the first black female saint of the modern era, was beatified on this day in 1992, part of a push within the Catholic Church to honor both black Catholics and to signify the horrors of human trafficking. This practice, also known as modern slavery, accounts for the bondage of an estimated 50 million people today, spread over every continent and present in every country. Bakhita herself was kidnapped as a child in Sudan and

later held against her will in Italy before essentially suing for freedom in 1889 and becoming a nun. Her legacy is now global, as she is the patron of all human trafficking survivors. May she inspire us to recognize the silent suffering of so many and work for the freedom of all God's children.

#### Thursday, May 18, 2023

#### A family reunion

Although Americans tend to not do much beyond Mass to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension, in some parts of Europe (Germany, most notably), the day involves special festivities. Because the day celebrates Jesus returning to his Father, it is the German Father's Day, usually celebrated with picnics or outings. Take a moment today to return in prayer to your heavenly Creator.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD (HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION)

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23; Matthew 28:16-20 (58) or Acts 18:1-8; John 16:16-20 (294). "This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

#### Friday, May 19, 2023

#### Lessons in hope

Christians are a hopeful people—an Easter people, if you will. In encouraging young people to hold on to hope, Pope Francis advises: "Dream of a world still not seen, but will certainly come one day. Think of those who sailed oceans, scaled mountains, conquered slavery, or made life better for people on earth." Hope allows us to trust in Christ's promises that his Holy Spirit lives within us, that our lives have purpose, and that we can make a difference. Start small. As Saint Augustine advises: "You aspire to great things? Begin with little ones."

#### **Saturday, May 20, 2023**

#### Preaching to the heart

Bernardine of Siena (1380-1444), a Franciscan priest, lived at a time in Italy when most preachers proclaimed their sermons from the pulpit during the liturgy and to cloistered clerics. Bernardine was among the first to preach to the public. He was so effective a preacher that cynical civil authorities would invite him to their towns because of the money to be made from the large crowds that gathered to hear him. No matter, Bernardine touched hearts and minds in a priceless way. Seek out preaching that feeds your soul.

MEMORIAL OF BERNARDINE OF SIENA, PRIEST TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 18:23-28; John 16:23b-28 (296). "Amen, amen, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you."

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

#### May 14, 2023 6th Sunday of Easter

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We are not orphans anymore! This Easter, that's the story we should share with others. It's the true story we are living right now
