

Father, Son and Holy Spirit

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - Year A



Father Arthur Marat

St. Athanasias once wrote: "God became man so that man might become God." The Gospel reading affirms this: God the Father gave His only Son, Jesus, so that we might have eternal life. By becoming human, Jesus made it possible for us to enter into and participate in the Divine Life of the Holy Trinity. This participation, how-

ever, does not begin after we die. It begins now during every single Mass!

When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, it is not only Jesus who is present, but also God the Father and the Holy Spirit. This means that, when we receive the Eucharist, we receive the Holy Trinity into our bodies, hearts, and souls, and we become transformed into what we partake. With every Eucharist we worthily receive, we become more like God. If this is not a fascinating and mind-boggling mystery, then I do not know what is!

As this Sunday readings gently remind us: like the Israelites in the first reading and the Corinthians in the second reading, we can be "stiff-necked people" who need to "mend [our] ways." How do we do that? The answer is simple: through the sacraments, the source of grace. In the second reading, St. Paul closes his letter with the words, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God [the Father] and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." He wishes "grace" upon the early Christians. Why? Because grace is God's gift. This gift has the power to transform us in such an extraordinary way that we become open to God, receptive and more responsive to Him, and ever clearer reflections of the Holy Trinity. Nowhere does this grace come to us more efficaciously and directly than in the Eucharist, which nourishes us with charity for God and for others.

And so, every time you approach the altar to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, I hope that you will remember the extraordinary promise associated with it: **God became man so that we might become God**.




St. Mark's Food Collection: June 11

What is an AED?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a lightweight, portable device. It delivers an electric shock through the chest to the heart when it detects an abnormal rhythm and changes the rhythm back to normal.

AEDs help people who have a sudden cardiac arrest, which occurs when the heart suddenly stops beating regularly. This happens when the heart's natural electrical system doesn't work correctly. If not treated within minutes, cardiac arrest quickly leads to death. Sudden cardiac arrest is one of the leading causes of death in the US. Over 350,000 people will suffer from sudden cardiac arrest this year.

AEDs are intended for use by the general public (lay responders). AEDs, unlike hospital defibrillators, require little training. First aid, basic life support and CPR, or cardiopulmonary resuscitation, classes teach a layperson how to use the device. The fully operational and easy-to-use device allows a trained, non-medical professional to perform necessary life-saving procedures before



an ambulance arrives. According to the American Heart Association, the AED uses voice prompts, lights and text to tell the rescuer the steps to take.

Publicly accessible AEDs are usually stored in brightly colored cases and placed in open areas of buildings. The American Heart Association explains that AEDs are the greatest advancement in publicly accessed treatment for cardiac arrest since CPR. AEDs save lives!

Our Lady of the Wayside has four AED located on our campus:

- 1. The foyer between the Church and the Gathering Place
- 2. The Father Mackin Center/gym
- 3. Outside the Elementary School Office
- 4. By the front desk in the Parish Center



Bystander CPR Training was offered in September last year. Illinois Heart Rescue instructor taught parishioners CPR basics and how to properly use an AED.

Widen the circle

Trinity Sunday isn't for parsing the Three-in-One. It's an invitation to meditate on the mutual self-giving of Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier, who "so love the world" that we all share in the divine embrace. Yet to child victims of aggression, their experience has felt outside of any caring circle. That's why the U.N.'s "Convention on the Rights of the Child" was the most rapidly and widely ratified rights treaty in history. It ensures every child has a right to life, a name, family or guardian, health care, education, freedom of religion—even the right to play. Encircle the children in your life with tenderness.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY TODAY'S READINGS: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18 (164). "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son."

Monday, Jun 05, 2023

Make your life a work of art

Artist and author on interreligious thought, Frederick Franck was born in 1909 in Holland and died on this day in 2006 in Warwick, New York—the place of his life's work, Pacem in Terris ("Peace on Earth"), a garden of more than 70 sculptures, open free to the public and dedicated to Pope John XXIII, Dr. Albert Schweitzer, and the Buddhist teacher D.T. Suzuki. Raised agnostic in a Catholic region of his country and a student of Zen Buddhism, Franck was inspired during the Cuban Missile Crisis to go to Rome in 1963 to draw all the sessions of the Second Vatican Council. "Art is neither a profession nor a hobby, it is a way of being," he said. Take inspiration to creatively express your spirituality in your own way of being.

Tuesday, Jun 06, 2023

One bread, one body

A painting by Flemish artist Peter Paul Rubens—called *The Defenders of the Eucharist*—includes a serene Saint Norbert, his white robes wrapped around a *ciborium* (the cup that holds the consecrated Eucharist) as he cradles the Blessed Sacrament. Norbert founded the Norbertine religious order as well as the first Third Order for laypeople embracing the spirit of religious life. And, as a successful peacemaker, he's often depicted with an olive branch. But Norbert's preaching about the Blessed Sacrament, convincing entire villages to reclaim their lost belief in the Real Presence—also having eucharistic miracles happen on his watch—has earned him the title "Apostle of the Blessed Sacrament." May he inspire our devotion as the National Eucharistic Revival enters its second phase this month.

Wednesday, Jun 07, 2023

Transcending prejudice in service to God

This day marks the 105th death anniversary of Servant of God Julia Greeley, one of seven African-American Catholics on the path to sainthood. She is one of two such candidates born into slavery in Ralls County, Missouri during the mid-19th century,

alongside Venerable Augustus Tolton. Freed during the Civil War, she emigrated to Colorado with her employer and became a Catholic due to their influence. There she would become known as "Denver's Angel of Charity" despite her own poverty, assisting the destitute at night so as not to offend her white beneficiaries. She died in 1918 and was the first and only Catholic layperson to lay in repose in the city—later becoming the first buried in the cathedral. May her legacy of service live on in all of us.

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 3:1-11a, 16-17a; Mark 12:18-27 (355). "When they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but they are like the angels in heaven."

Thursday, Jun 08, 2023

Love begets love

It's June, a popular month for weddings in North America. Church teachings about marriage varied for the first millennium. Today they communicate high ideals, resting on this basic framework, paraphrased from the Catechism of the Catholic Church: God loves us with a definitive and irrevocable love; married couples share in this love, which supports and sustains them. Their faithfulness to each other witnesses God's persistent love. Many are called to marriage, but others follow a different path. How has God called you to share the love poured out on you?

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 6:10-11; 7:1bcde, 9-17; 8:4-9a; Mark 12:28-34 (356). "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength."

Friday, Jun 09, 2023

A troubled land calls for compassion

Saint Ephrem of Syria was a prolific writer of poetry, hymns, poems, sermons, and biblical commentaries. He has been called the most significant of all the fathers of the Syriac-speaking church tradition. He addressed the church in Syria in troubled times ... and Syria's troubles continue, perhaps never more acutely than today. Already suffering badly the devastation of 12 years of ruthless suppression, in February it suffered a devastating earthquake that killed more than 7,000 people and devastated more than 10,000 buildings in northwest Syria. The U.N. reports that more than 4 million Syrians, mostly women and children, depend on humanitarian aid to survive. Mercy USA invites donations for housing for destitute Syrians. Consider a donation in honor of Ephrem.

The widow's mite revisited

It is ironic that the story of the widow's mite in today's gospel is so often used as an example of generous giving when it's obvious that giving "all she had, her whole livelihood" had left her destitute and penniless. Jesus actually uses the widow's action as an example of what happens when the unscrupulous clergy of his day, with their long robes and the esteem of the people, "devour the houses of widows." The lesson is for religious leaders *not* to push poor people into deeper poverty. Pray for your pastors.

TODAY'S READINGS: Tobit 12:1, 5-15, 20; Mark 12:38-44 (358). "They devour the houses of widows They will receive a very severe condemnation."

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

June 4, 2023 The Most Holy Trinity

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.


