



GOD'S GREATEST GIFT

Solemnity of the Most Precious Body and Blood of Christ

What we think of as our lives—the joys and sorrows, the ups and downs of work, marriage, schooling, religious practice and everything that occupies us—is nothing more than the spiritual, physical, emotional, and moral desert in which the Israelites found themselves. Our earthly life is like the vast wilderness, where God

"test[s us] by affliction and find[s] out whether or not it [is our] intention to keep his commandments."

And yet, within the desert we have the opportunity to receive the unfathomable, unthinkable, incomprehensible source of life: the Most Precious Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ! When God created us, He knew that we would become discouraged, tired, fatigued, and helpless by the circumstances of our existence. And so, He gives us the wellspring of eternal life: the Eucharist. Every time we receive the Body and Blood of the Lord, we become enlivened, not just temporarily (like we would after a refreshing drink when thirsty or a delicious meal when hungry), but eternally. Every moment that we spend before the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus transforms and strengthens us by His gaze of love. Every opportunity we worthily partake of the Precious Blood and Body of Jesus in the Eucharist, we enter into real life—Heaven, which is none other than union with God. Can you imagine what this means?

It is so easy to approach the Eucharist mechanically, without thinking, out of pure habit. We all do it. But when we approach God in this way we miss something so amazingly unfathomable: the gift of Himself. Every year we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi because the Church in Her wisdom knows that we need to be reminded of this Scripture passage: "What great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God, is to us...?" (*Deut 4:7*). Here in the desert of life, the Eucharist is the greatest gift we could ever receive—it is God Himself poured out for us out of love and out of His insatiable desire to give us true life, eternal life, and the unending joys of Heaven.

For this reason, nothing is more precious, more holy, more glorious and more worthy of our love and devotion than the Precious Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.





How to Stay Safe at the Pool This Summer



According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, drowning is a leading cause of death in children. Misconceptions about drowning can cause people to let their guard down when at a pool or on vacation. Knowing the best prevention measures and how to identify drowning when it's happening is key.

"While safety precautions are important, the most important thing is to have a water watcher close to children when they are in the water. Many people think that drowning is a loud, visible process, but people do not realize how quiet it can be and how quickly it can happen for children," says Dr. Deanna Behrens, a

pediatric critical care physician at Advocate Children's Hospital.

Drowning incidents frequently occur in public places. While having lifeguards on duty offers an added layer of protection, it can also give a false sense of security as you may assume someone else has eyes on your child. However, it can be very difficult to quickly spot a drowning child in a crowded pool.

One hack some lifeguards and swim instructors recommend is to avoid dressing your child in a blue bathing suit. The thought is that brighter tones or more colorful patterns may help spot your child in a crowd more easily. While the hack hasn't been scientifically proven, Dr. Behrens says there's no harm in trying it as an added safety measure. She adds that the most important precaution is having eyes on your child at all times.

"The number one tip is direct supervision with touch or visual sight. There's no substitution for that. That's why we recommend having a dedicated water watcher for every one or two children swimming. This person shouldn't be on their phone, drinking alcohol or doing other things. If the adult is distracted, even if they're just a couple feet away and even for a minute, their full attention isn't necessarily on the children, which is a huge risk," Dr. Behrens says.

This person should be a strong swimmer who has experience with water, and it doesn't necessarily need to be a parent. If there are multiple adults present, Dr. Behrens recommends rotating the person in that role to help share responsibility. She adds that it's important to always have a designated water watcher regardless of group size, even if you're just at home.

If you do have a pool in your yard, make sure there's a barrier around it and that it's kept shut to prevent a child from wandering into the water. If you have an inflatable pool, Dr. Behrens says to empty and drain it after each use.

Swimming can be a fun and healthy family activity, but safe swimming is key. The AAP recommends swimming lessons for children over the age of one, if medically appropriate.

"Even if a child has completed lessons and is a good swimmer, accidents can happen. They could hit their head, get tired or overestimate their swimming abilities," says Dr. Behrens.

If a drowning incident does occur, try to remove the child from the water, if it's safe to do so, call 911 and wait for help. Always have a child checked by a medical professional after any drowning incident.



We are one

Unity is what our sacrament of Communion is about: oneness with God and each other. Yet, because we're human, that communion is necessarily paired up with another sacrament that does the work of reconciling. When unity gets torn, reconciliation repairs the damage. Lately, toxic polarization has been shredding our national unity, creating an illusion of insurmountable division. Media sources sharpen the knives of contrasting worldviews, leading to anxiety and depression, fear and violence. Trust in unity. Resist being recruited in the polarization game.

Unexpected blessings

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus offers the Beatitudes, a list of those who are blessed—some of whom are not who listeners would expect to hear are blessed: the poor in spirit, the mournful, the meek, and the persecuted. In some Bible versions, "blessed" is translated as "happy," which makes it even harder to believe that those named could possibly be that! Jesus was always turning conventional wisdom inside out and upside down—enlightening and enraging people alike. Two thousand years later, we're still trying to figure out how to be happy. If pursuing what the world says "should" make you happy doesn't, take a cue from Jesus and try flipping that faulty logic on its head!

TODAY'S READINGS: 2 Corinthians 1:1-7; Matthew 5:1-12 (359). "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

Go for the grandeur

Church historian Sophronius Clasen liked to say Saint Anthony preached the "grandeur of Christianity," using allegory and symbolic explanations to convey biblical wisdom. Anyone can spot such examples in the Sermons of Saint Anthony, including: "Genesis says: The spirit of God moved over the waters Just as the mind of a craftsman broods over the work he is going to do, and as the bird broods over the egg from which her young will be hatched, so the Spirit of God brooded over the waters, from which were to be made all things." Let Anthony's words stir your heart today.

A salute to justice

On this day each year, the United States commemorates the adoption of the national flag, our venerable Stars and Stripes. "A new constellation," it was said to represent, in the vast array of the world powers. But as we, in Christian charity, work for a better world as good and faithful Americans, we must be careful to live as citizens of heaven first and foremost, workers of light rather than earthly empire, children of God and not of worldly dominion. May our Flag Day commemorations also remember those who have been forgotten in the American project and whose cries for justice

may still be unanswered. May our waving of "Old Glory" be for the glory of the God above all.

The law as Jesus taught it

Matthew uses the word "righteousness" seven times in his gospel. What is he getting at? The U.S. bishops boil it down to this: "While righteousness in the new age will continue to mean conduct that is in accordance with the law, it will be conduct in accordance with the law as expounded and interpreted by Jesus." In other words, we need to absorb the full example and teachings of Jesus to live a righteous life. That's a tall order, which is precisely why we need each other for support and guidance. How can you support a fellow disciple today?

TODAY'S READINGS: 2 Corinthians 3:15—4:1, 3-6; Matthew 5:20-26 (362). "I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter into the Kingdom of heaven."

Friday, Jun 16, 2023

Put your heart into it

On May 25, 1899, Pope Leo XIII promulgated the encyclical *Annum sacrum*, which consecrated the entire world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Leo called this the "great act" of his papacy. In an interview with Catholic News Service, Father Ambrose Dobrozsi of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati says that this solemnity, "shows that humanity still needs and longs for a compassionate and all-powerful God. ... In a society where some live in decadence and prideful luxury while others are destitute, the burning love of Christ's Sacred Heart reminds us that the fires of his mercy are also fires of justice." Consecrate your own heart to the effort to create a more compassionate and just world.

A heartfelt conversion is possible

Most of us would rather not reveal our inner lives since we often harbor some measure of anger, judgment, prejudice, hatred, lust, envy, jealousy, bitterness, resentment, and fear. Jesus said that all evil in the world springs forth from the human heart. But the Immaculate Heart of Mary is a celebration of a different kind of inner life, with virtues beyond measure and beyond our imagination. Mary, the ultimate intercessor, will help us convert the vices of the heart into virtues.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. 
