
My brothers and sisters, in today's readings we hear about one main topic: wisdom. The wisdom about which Scripture speaks is not something that a person can learn or buy with money. It is also not something that is guaranteed by age. Wisdom is not a matter of good will or even a person's special aptitude for it. **True wisdom**


is a gift from the Holy Spirit.

As we see from the first reading from the First Book of Kings, God gives the gift of wisdom to each person who seeks to follow the right way, even in the midst of joys and difficulties, suffering and pain. God bestows the gift of wisdom on those who humbly ask for it, as Solomon asked for the gift of understanding and a heart to judge and distinguish between right and wrong, and God gave him wisdom along with everything else: riches, fame, and a long life on the earth.

God comes to us every day and tells each one of us: "Ask something of Me and I will give it to you." Each day we are called as Christians to respond. What do you ask God for in your daily lives? Do you ask Him for wisdom or for your sanctification? Or do you ask him for riches, for fame, for intelligence, for a long life? Do not be afraid of your answer to this question. Stand in truth before God about it. Part of wisdom is discovering who we are—discovering that God Loves us as we are, with all of the truth about us. On our part, all that God calls us to do is imitate Solomon, who acknowledged his weakness before the Lord as a "mere youth" and awaited everything from Him.

The Value of Establishing a Primary Care Doctor

Primary care physicians are your go-to partners in overall health and well-being. Not only are they a resource for preventive care, but they can also diagnose and treat various medical conditions.

A study found the percentage of Americans with a primary care doctor is declining. Why the drop? It could be that some don't know why they need primary care or what they should talk about with their doctor.

"It's important to have a primary care doctor because they personally know you and your medical history over the course of time," says Dr. Patricia Jaimes-Huerta, a family medicine physician at Advocate Sherman Hospital in Elgin, Ill. "This longtime relationship enables a more personalized approach to care."



During preventive visits, you should ask your doctor about any health risk factors you have based on medical and family history.

If your parent or close relative has a medical condition, it can put you at a higher risk, explains Dr. Jaimes-Huerta. Your doctor may recommend appropriate screenings and lifestyle changes to help reduce your risk.

Additionally, be prepared to share your nutritional habits, exercise routine, sleep patterns and any stressors you may have. This information paints a picture of your general health so your doctor can

make recommendations to help set you up for success.

"As primary care doctors, we want to partner with patients to help them set short-term and long-term goals for their health," shares Dr. Jaimes-Huerta.

If your appointment is related to an existing chronic condition, such as diabetes, talk to your doctor about your treatment plan and any concerns you have.

"It's crucial to know if a patient is experiencing side effects, having trouble affording their medication, or if their work hours aren't conducive to taking their medications appropriately," says Dr. Jaimes-Huerta. "Once we have this information, we can make a plan to address these barriers."

In a patient-provider relationship, honesty is the best policy.

Dr. Jaimes-Huerta emphasizes the importance of a relationship built on trust. The more honest you are about your health, the more informed care your primary care doctor can provide.

Speak his name without shame

Spanish priest Ignatius of Loyola founded the Society of Jesus (along with Saints Peter Faber and Francis Xavier) in Paris in 1541. Members of this religious order are known as Jesuits. Today, the Jesuits are the largest male religious order in the church, and Pope Francis is the first Jesuit pope. The term Jesuit was originally meant as an insult, meaning "someone who too frequently used the name of Jesus." Ignatius never used the term, but members later embraced it with positive meaning. After all, how could anyone use the name of Jesus too much? Take a cue from the Jesuits and don't hold back!

Our saving grace

Alphonsus gave us much, but perhaps the greatest gift was his fight against the Jansenist heresy, encapsulated in his 1748 volume Moral Theology. Thanks to Alphonsus, Catholicism has been able to steer a middle path between a darkly pessimistic view of human worth on the one hand and moral laxity on the other. Jansenists held an extreme view of original sin, believing only some are pre-ordained for salvation, saying grace had little chance of saving the rest—even through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Alphonsus encourages us to trust and use the sacrament, but also to "acquire the habit of speaking to God as if you were alone with Him, familiarly and with confidence and love, as to the dearest and most loving of friends."

As we honor Saints Eusebius and Peter Julian Eymard, two staunch defenders of the faith during their times, we would do well to remember that "faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals his love," writes Pope Francis in *Lumen*

Fidei. How do we encounter God? Any embrace of love is a start, but Peter Eymard is more specific: "Happy the soul that knows how to find Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, and in the Eucharist all things!"

We can take heart in the notion that God is with us as well, along for the ride so to speak. He will not leave us orphaned. Call on God today, he's right there with you.

John Vianney was dedicated to helping people understand and live the Catholic faith. On the street, in the confessional, and in his writings, John offered wisdom and counsel to encourage people. He wrote many small catechetical teachings collected within his "Little Catechism." In one, John writes, "The Holy Spirit is like a gardener cultivating our souls." The soul as a garden is a beautiful image to meditate on. What does your garden look like? How are you growing in your relationship with God? With John, let us pray his words: "O God, send me Your Spirit to teach me what I am and what You are."

The 16th-century Italian priest Saint Philip Neri liked to organize a walk through Rome with a few of his friends and acquaintances, visiting churches along the journey. It was a nice way to combine friendly conversation and a shared religious activity. The churches they visited—St. Peter's Basilica, St. Paul Outside-the-Walls, St. Sebastian's, St. John Lateran, Holy Cross-in-Jerusalem, St. Lawrence-Outside-the Walls, and the Basilica of St. Mary Major—became known as the Seven Pilgrim Churches of Rome and the walk is now repeated annually on Wednesday of Holy Week. Seek out holy places wherever you live—they can be a refuge in difficult times.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

July 30, 2023 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.
