St. Mark's Food Collection: August 13


On Sunday, August 13 we will have our monthly food drive for St. Mark's Parish. Drop off non-perishable food at the parish garage from between 9 am and noon.

HUMBLE MEANS

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

The famous philosopher Jacques Maritain said that the Church uses two kinds of means for spiritual ends. The first kind of means is called rich, temporal means. Rich means are things like organizations, meetings, parish centers, and mass media. These means can be dangerous because it is easy to attribute them to ourselves and

not to God, the Giver of all good gifts. This is pride. Today is the feast of the Transfiguration. Jesus brought three Apostles: Peter, James, and John, with him to Mount Tabor. On this mountain, Jesus was transfigured. His clothes became dazzling white. We can imagine that He looked glorious and triumphant. At this moment, Jesus used rich means. And it was possible to see the effects of these rich means in His whole being.

The second kind of means is humble means. Humble means is the acceptance of suffering out of love for God. For example, when you pray and your knees hurt, or when you discover that your life is very ordinary, or when no one seems to care about your difficulties—these are humble means.

In the Church, we are accustomed to rich means. We are accustomed to implementing many programs, ministries, events, etc. While this is not bad in itself, it often overshadows the fact that Jesus most often used humble means. He was born in a dark cave in Bethlehem. He grew up poor, living day to day. He was even dejected and rejected on Mount Calvary. And today, He is the poorest and most vulnerable in the Eucharist.

The Church has a treasure that no one can take away from it both as an institution and within each of our lives as Christ's followers: humble means. And, in order to use these humble means, we need only two things: good will and love. People can take away the Church's money, buildings, and organizations. But no one can take away the good will and charity of Jesus' followers.

Let us try to follow Jesus' example. Let us use rich means and humble means, but always with good will and charity.

It is my pleasure to share with the parish that we have two adult volunteers who have agreed to provide continuity to the high school teen program and revive the 7th-8th grade middle school program.





How to Get Relief From Common Bug Bites

Though the warm temperatures and summer rain are great for your lawn, garden and mental health, it can also hatch a new generation of mosquitos and ticks who need to eat blood to survive. Even if you take preventive measures, the best-laid plans can result in a bug bite that usually needs at least minimal treatment.

MOSQUITO BITES:

It is recommended to first disinfect the area with soap and water. Then apply ice as needed for 10 minutes to help relieve some of the itching and swelling symptoms. Use over-the-counter topical antihistamine creams, topical steroids and anti-itch creams to relieve itching by following the product instructions or even trying a few effective home remedies.

"Try to avoid scratching mosquito bites to avoid creating any infection," says Dr. Jūratė Kunickaite, a family medicine physician at Advocate Outpatient Center in Aurora, Ill. "Seek medical advice if you begin developing any signs of redness, warmth, pain or discomfort near the mosquito bite."

Dr. Kunickaite adds that if you experience any symptoms such as fever, swollen lymph nodes, hives, headaches, worsening areas of redness or swelling, fatigue, red eyes, or painful joints, especially in the hands or feet, to seek medical advice. The Zika virus and West Nile Virus can cause serious or life-threatening symptoms. So, when in doubt, get it checked out.

TICK BITES:

If you happen to get a tick bite, it is important to remember in most cases a tick must be attached for 36 to 48 hours or more before it can transfer the most common Lyme disease-causing bacteria (Borrelia burgdorferi) to humans. Always remove the tick with tweezers and firmly grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible with an upward, steady motion. Next, be sure to clean the area with a disinfectant such as rubbing alcohol or soap and water.

"If you do not feel comfortable removing the tick, then you can always seek medical attention," says Dr. Michael Ross, a family medicine physician at Advocate Outpatient Center in Batavia, Ill. "Health care professionals can determine if any antibiotic prophylaxis or treatment is needed based upon your circumstances."

Dr. Ross cautions to continue monitoring the tick bite within the next thirty days for any signs of a tickborne illness which includes fatigue, headache, muscle aches, joint pain, swelling, fever or a rash. If you experience any new symptoms, contact your health care professional immediately.

Though best to avoid mosquito and tick bites, when it does happen, know that most can be taken care of on your own with common supplies. If it gets worse, your primary care provider can assist with the next treatment steps.



May your faith ripen sweetly

It's about this time of year that grapes in many parts of the world begin a crucial transformation process the French have named *veraison*. It's when grapes start to ripen and change from green to purple—not always at the same time in the same cluster, making for some beautiful color combinations. Mostly likely because of the timing of his feast day, Pope Sixtus II is the patron saint of grape prosperity. Where are you in the midst of your own *veraison* as a Christian? Pray for cause to celebrate your faith bearing ripe fruit.

MEMORIAL OF SIXTUS II, POPE, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS TODAY'S READINGS: Numbers 11:4b-15; Matthew 14:13-21 (407). "They all ate and were satisfied."

For want of a better word

When Dominic founded the Order of Preachers in 1216, he'd been appalled by the rise of the Albigensian heresy, denying the goodness of God's creation. Even more appalling was the lack of informed preaching to inoculate the congregation against it. Dominic threw himself into the kind of witness modeled by the Acts of the Apostles, his new religious community adopting the motto "to praise, to bless, to preach." Not surprisingly, the Dominicans have given us eloquent saints, including Catherine of Siena and Thomas Aquinas—even captivating the world in 1963 with a chart-topping pop song, "Dominique." To quote another Dominican, Saint Martin de Porres: "Everything, even sweeping ... could be a prayer, if it were offered to God."

The awful truth

The bombing of Nagasaki, which occurred on this day in 1945, was truly awful in all senses of the word. Splitting the atom to unleash its enormous power put the genius and depravity of humanity on full, awe-inspiring display. Though we have many positive uses for atomic energy, its initial use to increase our

capacity to kill on a massive scale is a moral failure that we have yet to overcome. The war machine rages on. What role will you play in helping humanity move toward the good?

Where's your treasure?

During the persecution of the Early Church, Saint Lawrence was under a death threat from Emperor Valerian. But his persecutor offered a deal. Lawrence could live if he turned over the treasures of the church. In one of history's most audacious rebukes, Lawrence is said to have gathered the poor and sick and told Valerian: Here is our treasure. For his act of resistance and faith, Lawrence was burned to death. How do you resist injustice? Saint Lawrence, give us courage.

FEAST OF LAWRENCE, DEACON, MARTYR TODAY'S READINGS: 2 Corinthians 9:6-10; John 12:24-26 (618). "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life."

Love takes its toll

Inspired by her mentor Saint Francis, Saint Clare and the women who eventually joined her to form the Poor Clares had a "radical commitment to corporate poverty." The women lived simply and spent most of their day in prayer and chores. It was a hard life, but one filled with joy for those who chose it—and continue to choose it. Spend time today pondering this pearl of wisdom from Clare: "Love that does not know of suffering is not worthy of the name."

MEMORIAL OF CLARE, RELIGIOUS FOUNDER TODAY'S READINGS: Deuteronomy 4:32-40; Matthew 16:24-28 (411). "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

Youthful endeavors

According to the United Nations website, half the people on Planet Earth are under 30 years of age. Yet only 2.6 percent of government lawmakers worldwide are under 30. International Youth Day, observed annually on August 12, is designated by the United Nations to draw attention to cultural and legal issues surrounding youth. Pope Francis teaches in *Laudato Si'*, "What kind of world do we want to leave ... to children who are now growing up?" (#160). International Youth Day recognizes everyone's responsibility to hand on a sustainable, free, and secure Earth to the next generation. What's going on in your community to accomplish this goal?

The Transfiguration of the Lord

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.
