TRUST IN HIS LOVE

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Today the gospel according to Matthew tells about Jesus walking on the Sea to his disciples. When the disciples saw him, they thought they were seeing a ghost. Jesus said to them with love, **“Do not be afraid”**. Peter made the decision to go to Jesus on the water, but was afraid when he saw that the waves were so high and the wind so strong, he began to sink and cried out to Jesus “Lord save me”. Jesus then stretched out His hands to calm the waters and to save Peter.

This gospel is about how Jesus loves his disciples and how the love of the disciples for Jesus was not perfect. And today I would like to say how important is it that we believe that Jesus truly loves us.

Each person in the whole world needs acceptance and love. This is a fundamental psychological need. However, when people seek love and acceptance, they are wounded by other people. How often people wound each other!

Faith tells us that there is only one acceptance—the acceptance of Christ, who always loves us. Saint John Paul II said that when we receive Holy Communion, Jesus receives us more than we receive Him. He receives us as we are. This means that Jesus accepts and loves us.

My Brothers and Sisters, it is very important to believe that Jesus waits for us in the Eucharist. It is very important that our faith in His love increases.

We know how parents love their children. They wait with great longing and anticipation for a teenage child to come home at night. The more parents wait for their child, the greater is their torment in looking forward to seeing their child again.

Let us imagine, then, how Jesus loves us. In the Eucharist, Jesus experiences what psychology calls the torment of looking for someone to come.

When we believe that Jesus wants to meet with us in the Eucharist, going to Mass will not become a routine for us. **When we discover how Jesus loves us, we will be His greatest fans.** We will not be able to live without Him. We will not be able to live without the Mass because Jesus will become our spiritual food, our excitement, our joy, and our interest.

Getting Your Child's Sleep Schedule Back-to-School Ready

Getting back into the school routine isn't always easy, especially when it comes to sleep. During the summer months, many children, particularly adolescents, fall into the habit of staying up later and sleeping in longer than they would during the school year. This can make adjusting to those early morning wake-ups difficult for the first few weeks.

"Reacclimating to waking up early for school and going to bed earlier is a lot like adjusting to a new 'time zone,'" explains Dr. Innessa Donskoy, a pediatric sleep specialist at Advocate Children's Hospital in Park Ridge, Ill. "The best way to do this is through being consistent."

To help your family prepare for the start of another school year, Dr. Donskoy offers the following tips:

- Begin waking your child up in the morning 15-30 minutes earlier in the weeks leading up to school starting. Every 4-7 days, move that wake-up time 15-30 minutes earlier until school starts. By the time school begins, this should help your child have a much easier time waking up and getting ready for school.
- Focus on when your child wakes up in the morning instead of when they go to sleep.
- Let bright light into your child's bedroom in the morning. This will help signal to their body that it is time for them to wake up.



"If you forget to start waking your child up earlier in that final month before school starts, that's okay, too. Sometimes we don't even think about any of this until school begins," Dr. Donskoy says. "In that case, the key is keeping the weekends looking like the weekdays do. Focus on your child's wake up time and avoid naps during the day."

She says that many parents believe allowing their child to "catch up" on sleep over the weekends may seem totally harmless, but that pattern can lead to a mismatch of their internal "time zone" through the week. This can actually perpetuate issues with getting sufficient sleep on weekdays, the days they arguably need it the most.

"That's why I recommend aligning your child's sleep-wake phase earlier by having them wake at the same time on the weekend as they would on a weekday. This consistency will help your child be as rested as possible and ready for school," says Dr. Donskoy.

Without a doubt, love reigns

Thanks to Thomas the Apostle—that so-called "Doubting Thomas"—Catholic tradition has its earliest account of Mary's Assumption. This tradition holds that, just as Thomas was elsewhere when the other apostles were visited by a resurrected Jesus, he'd likewise been away when Mary, surrounded by the apostles, drew her last earthly breath. As Thomas returned to Jerusalem, three days after Mary's burial, it is said that he saw her gloriously lifted into the heavens. This time, it was the other apostles' turn to doubt Thomas. With great skepticism, tradition tells us, they opened her tomb and found it empty. Pope John Paul II, quoting Saint Francis de Sales, insisted that Mary died "in love, from love, and through love." Love like Mary today.

An oft-forgotten holy figure, Saint Roch died on this day in the 14th-century Holy Roman Empire, having lived a distinctive life from his birth. He is traditionally regarded as having been conceived by a miracle and later became an ascetic said to have

worked miracles. The patron saint of dogs, he is said to have been healed from the plague by a dog that brought him bread while he was recovering. He modeled for the world a divine confidence in the face of pestilence, which inspired great faith in God among his peers. Having survived a pandemic ourselves, will we trust God with our future as Saint Roch did?

Farmers and home gardeners are often busy in mid-August if their crops have done well. It is a time of intense work: harvesting, processing, selling, canning. The spiritual parallel is often made: Our missionary impulse is to plant the seeds of faith in word and action, in hopes that the seeds bear fruit. When times seem difficult, it is heartening to look around for signs of fruit, of God's love made manifest. Take a moment to revel in the witness of a Christian you know who makes God's love visible.

With that in mind, in 1995, in honor of the 100th anniversary of cinema, the Vatican named 45 important films worthy of watching. GOSPEL MEDITATION:

August 13, 2023

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

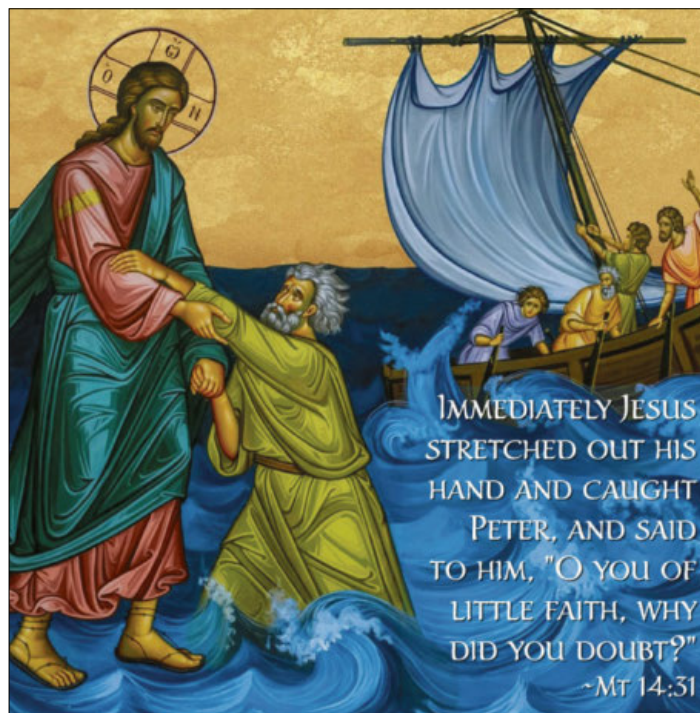
