To the adult volunteers:



Father O'Hara was a Pastor on a mission and unafraid to ask for the order.

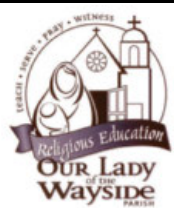

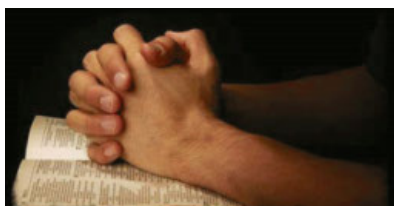

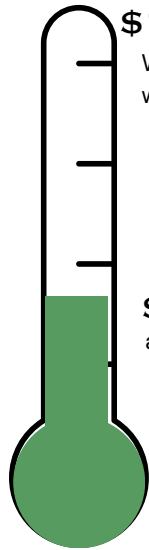

Find Relief From Heartburn With These Tips



Nearly every person will experience acid reflux at some point in their lives. It typically presents as a burning sensation in the chest that is oftentimes accompanied by an acidic, bitter taste. “When infrequent, acid reflux or heartburn can usually be controlled by simple lifestyle modifications,” explains Dr. Tatyana Taranukha, a gastroenterologist at Aurora Gastroenterology in Summit and Waukesha, Wis.

Dr. Taranukha offers the following suggestions for managing and finding relief from occasional acid reflux:

- **Do not smoke:** Nicotine can relax the lower esophageal sphincter, allowing gastric contents to enter the esophagus.
- **Maintain a healthy weight:** The sphincter’s ability to properly function and remain closed is affected by excess weight.
- **Avoid laying down 2-3 hours after eating:** Gravity plays a large role in keeping the contents of our stomach where they belong. Eating well before bedtime can help prevent nighttime symptoms. If you are still experiencing acid reflux in bed, sleep on an incline or keep your head elevated.
- **Eat and drink fewer things that trigger reflux:** Certain foods and beverages can worsen acid reflux symptoms, including coffee, carbonated beverages, alcohol, chocolate, greasy and spicy foods, tomatoes, garlic and onions.
- **Eat smaller meals:** A full stomach may lead to acid entering the esophagus more easily. Consider eating multiple, smaller meals and snacks throughout the day.

“If you find yourself experiencing acid reflux more than two times per week, you may have gastroesophageal reflux disease, or GERD, in which the gastric contents regularly enter the esophagus, causing heartburn and damage,” says Dr. Taranukha. “Speak with your doctor, who can connect you with a gastroenterologist. They will find the right medication or treatment for you.”

The value in variety

A founder of the NAACP, W.E.B. Du Bois knew the cure for racism wasn't simply telling the truth. It was inducing people to act on it. The first African American to receive a Ph.D. from Harvard in 1895, Du Bois dreamed broadly of a world of "valuable variety ... in height and weight, color and skin, hair and nose and lip.... Each effort to stop this freedom of being," he argued, "is a blow at democracy—that real democracy which is reservoir and opportunity.... There can be no perfect democracy curtailed by color, race, or poverty." Let us act on this truth.

"Late have I loved you, O Beauty, ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you!" he lamented. It's never too late to be swept away by what Augustine has to say: "To fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek him the greatest adventure; to find him, the greatest human achievement."

Prepare the way

Painting after painting shows John the Baptist pointing to Jesus. John knows it's not about him: "He who is coming after me is mightier than I" (Matthew 3:11) and "I am not the Christ, but I have been sent ahead of Him.... He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 2:28-30). Christian tradition also calls him John the Precursor and John the Forerunner, prepping us for the Messiah by being something of a prototype. Like Jesus, he's conceived miraculously. Both preach repentance, have disciples, and suffer in death. But as Saint Peter Julian Eymard knew, "The true secret of love consists in this—we must forget self like Saint John the Baptist and exalt and glorify the Lord."

A mother of 11 foster children always had a gaggle of kids buzzing around her. They were happy and well cared for. When there was even a hint of one crossing the line from lively to obnoxious, she simply said, "Make a better choice." Amazingly, they did. Those are powerful words. How can you make a better choice today?

What will help you walk in a manner worthy of the God who calls you into his Kingdom and glory? This advice from Saint Francis de Sales might prove useful: "Never miss an opportunity to do good."

In the United States, Catholic religious orders have built an extensive network of primary, secondary, and college-level institutions whose shared mission has been education of the whole person: spiritual, intellectual, and human development. Millions have been positively impacted by these schools, including many poor people who have improved their quality of life. Offer a prayer of thanks for the educators and others who pour their energies into this holy and wholistic education.

Celebrate the season of creation

In Catholic culture we use the phrase "care of creation" in our work to protect the Earth and develop sustainable ways to live. This phrase is deliberate because it underscores the inherent connection between God and all that is. Pope Francis writes in *Laudato Si'*, "The ultimate destiny of the universe is in the fullness of God, which has already been attained by the risen Christ." On this World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, let us renew our commitment to care for one another, land and sea, all creatures great and small, as together we move into the fullness of God to which all are called.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8; Matthew 25:1-13 (429). "Therefore, whoever disregards this, disregards not a human being but God, who also gives the Holy Spirit to you."

Talent contest

The parable of the Talents is about much more than money. It speaks of the gifts that God has given to each of us and how we choose to "invest" those gifts in the community. Are we seeking only the most limited return, for ourselves? Or are we sharing our gifts, doing our part to help build up the community? GOSPEL MEDITATION:

August 27, 2023

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isn't it a bit weird that Catholics call the Pope "papa," father? This Sunday provides us with essential Scriptural background on the papacy, the petrine office. Jesus gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven," after witnessing to the special grace Peter has to know Jesus' true identity. Many have pointed out that the "keys" refer back to the figure of Eliakim, King David's prime minister. True enough. But notice this is not mere authority or power. It's a family relationship. The Lord says to Eliakim, "He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Isaiah 22:21). David's prime minister was a spiritual *father* to the family of Israel. Peter, and his successors, will be spiritual fathers in the family of the Church.

This means we have a serious obligation to not only recognize the Pope's authority, but also to love him with the affection of children for their papa. We should never speak about him with disrespect or rancor. We should listen to him with trusting hearts, and ignore the slander thrown at him in various media. When we show the world we are loving and obedient to our Holy Papa, perhaps they'll see more clearly that the Church is indeed God's beloved family.

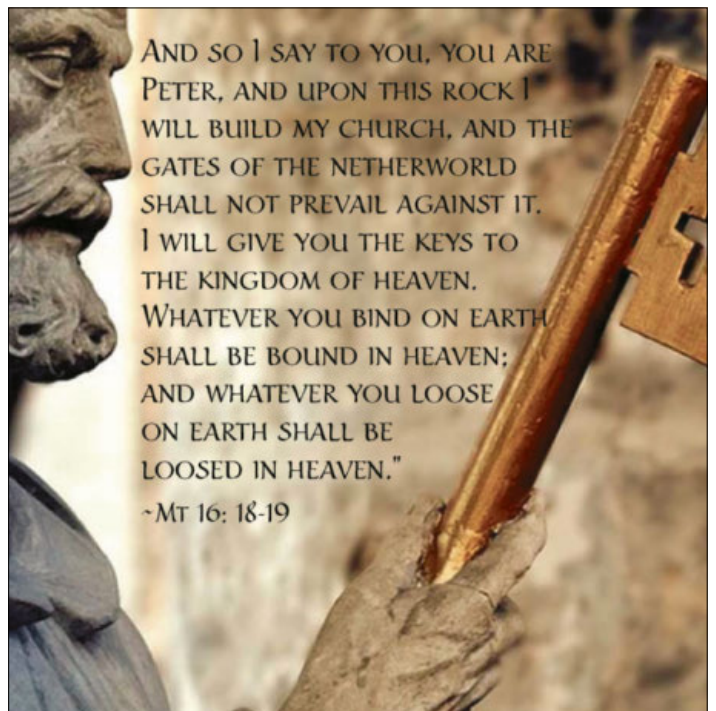
