#### "A man's faith journey"

"Why don't they do something about ...!" We all have probably been in a conversation where that question was asked. That question usually occurs when discussing an issue of great importance - when there is no easy answer. We may hear it when discussing violent crime, politics, the economy, why our favorite sports team is doing so poorly, or any number of issues.

Unfortunately, many times there is little, if anything we can do - and the question goes unanswered, with no guidance or direction. But there is an issue of great importance where we can get guidance and direction - that's in our relationship with God. We are created to develop an intimate relationship with God.

Many times, on our faith journey we start out with good intentions, but there's a lot of secular "noise" interference that can distract us. Where do we turn for guidance?

In recent years, many have listened to podcasts on their smartphones to "factoids" for guidance. Several years earlier many received guidance from listening to "WWJD" (What Would Jesus Do). Podcasts speak to our ears with "factoids." Listening to Jesus speaks to our heart about an eternal message.

#### How do we know where to turn?

This fall Our Lady of the Wayside is offering a program that focuses on the issue of a man's relationship with God. It's called . . . .

#### "That Man Is You"

Unlike the above example when we see issues of "great importance" we don't shrug and do nothing - we're called to action. That's the case with our life journey. This does require action from us.

But we all need guidance if we want to reach that ultimate goal - union with God. That's the message we hear from That Man Is You (TMIY).

The program is currently running in many parishes across the United States. Some of the comments from men already in the program are:

- It provides the opportunity to connect with other guys over our faith and how we live it in our lives.
- It's a chance to discuss our faith rather than only talk about sports or kids' activities.
- We meet people that we wouldn't normally meet • through our regular activities.

And, of course, the main reason is that it provides an excellent opportunity to gain a better understanding of our Catholic faith.

We may say, "I already know all I need to know of my faith. That is never true. There is always more to learn and experience.

In last Sunday's gospel we hear Peter declare to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." In today's gospel, on a different issue, we hear Jesus reply to Peter, "You are not thinking as God does, but as human beings do."

TMIY weekly sessions start with breakfast at 7am. A video presentation begins at 7:20, and is followed with small group discussions at 8am, and concludes at 8:30. The presentations feature excellent, well-known speakers.

The meetings start early so that we are free for the rest of the busy weekend.

Men of the parish, we all will learn from TMIY. I look forward to seeing you next Saturday! Please come!

### **CARRYING OUR CROSSES**

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A



As Jesus tells us in today's Gospel: in order to have a deep spiritual life, we must deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Jesus. The prophet Jeremiah in the first reading proves it. Jeremiah had a gentle nature. He was not a strong man. From a human point of view, he was not even fit to be a prophet. Nevertheless, God chose Jeremiah

to tell the people to change their lives and to return to God.

Yet, when Jeremiah tried to tell the people to change, they only responded by laughing at him and mocking him. Instead of listening to Jeremiah, the people derided and rejected him. And, this was Jeremiah's cross. Such humiliations were his cross.

Even more, we know that this cross was not easy for Jeremiah to carry; it was painful and bitter—so painful and bitter that Jeremiah was prepared to forget, and to stop speaking about God. He was ready to give up. Instead, he persevered. Despite his rebelliousness and complaints, Jeremiah continued to carry his cross, serve the people, and follow God.

Jeremiah's example, along with Jesus' testimony in the Gospel about the suffering he would have to endure, clearly reveals that the Church and each true member of the Church must go through persecution and suffering. Each person must carry his cross. For it is precisely the cross which leads to the triumph of the resurrection and eternal life.

Each of us has his own cross to carry. Each of us is also called, like Jeremiah, to serve the Church in a particular way. For us, it is a matter of discovering Jesus' presence in our daily lives in order to experience the deeper sense—the spiritual sense of the crosses that we carry and the ways in which we serve. **Therefore, on this day, let us pray: Jesus, please come to our hearts. Please come into our life. And please help us to carry our crosses.** Please come to us, Lord Jesus, and teach us how to discover Your ways and Your role in our life. Come and teach us to follow Your will and to transform our way of thinking.

Please come with Your power and help us to carry our crosses so that our yoke will become sweeter and our burden will become lighter.

Please come, Jesus, and lead us to eternal life as You led the prophet Jeremiah and St. Peter, despite their human thinking.


### St. Mark's Food Collection: SEPTEMBER 10

## KATHY O'NEILL, R.N. 👽 COORDINATOR OF PASTORAL HEALTHCARE Preventing Back-to-School Injuries

As another school year begins, buying school supplies and getting your family back into a routine may be top of mind. But avoiding orthopedic injuries may not be the first thing on your to-do list. But as a pediatric surgeon, I will tell you there are several prevention strategies you can easily incorporate into your back-to-school preparation to help keep your children healthy and safe throughout the year.

#### Shoes

Whether your child is beginning kindergarten or high school, you may be purchasing new footwear for them. When looking for shoes, in general, I recommend flat shoes with a thick sole, some amount of arch support and fit slightly wider than the foot. For the most part, the most comfortable and stable shoes will always be sneakers. Everyone's feet are slightly different, so it may take some trial and error to find the best shoes for your child.

#### Backpacks

They come in many sizes, shapes and varieties. But the best backpacks for spine health should have two wide,



well-padded shoulder straps. Straps should be adjusted and tightened so the bottom of the backpack does not sag below the lumbar spine when worn. The weight of the backpack should not exceed 15% of your child's body weight.

#### ACL injuries

When it comes to student athletes, the start of the academic year can mean an increased risk of injury regardless of the sport they play.

Anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) injuries are common in high school sports. They also are one of the most common injuries that require surgical treatment. The good news is that new data shows the risk of ACL rupture can be dramatically reduced in athletes who take part in an ACL prevention program. These programs, often led by coaches or athletic trainers, focus on teaching proper body mechanics as well as strengthening the muscles around the knee. Studies have shown athletes who participate in these programs have lower rates of knee injury. They have become commonplace in professional and college-level sports, and they are beginning to become more common in high schools, as well.

#### Concussions

Concussions are, unfortunately, a common injury among student athletes. Proper prevention strategies, which cannot be overstressed, include using a helmet and mouthguard, especially in football. Repeated concussions can have a profound impact on a student athlete, not just when it comes to their ability to participate in sports but also their academic studies.

If you have any questions or concerns about other ways to keep your child safe as they head back to school or start up with sports, don't hesitate to check in with their pediatrician.

#### Come aside and rest awhile

In a Prayer for Labor Day, the U.S. bishops invite us to ask God: "Make a place in our hearts for compassion to the men and women who labor tirelessly for basic necessities." Labor has always held a place of dignity within our faith. Scripture tells us that the laborer is worthy of his hire (1 Tim. 5:18), and many a church document, including *Rerum Novarum*, outline the value of workers and their work: "Justice, therefore, demands that the interests of the working classes should be carefully watched over, so that they who contribute so largely to the advantage of the community may themselves share in the benefits which they create." And, today, in honor of our labor, it's time to take a break.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Luke 4:16-30 (431). "Is this not the son of Joseph?"

#### The first daughter of charity

It's not every day that a Catholic saint is honored with a United Nations resolution. But then, Mother Teresa is hardly an everyday saint. The U.N. honored the famous nun from Kolkata, known the world over for her hands-on care of the poor, with a resolution in 2013. It declared that on the September 5th anniversary of Mother Teresa's death each year, the world would now observe an International Day of Charity. Let's take her at her word: "Love is not patronizing and charity isn't about pity, it is about love. Charity and love are the same—with charity you give love, so don't just give money but reach out your hand instead."

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6, 9-11; Luke 4:31-37 (432). "All of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness."

#### Wednesday, Sep 06, 2023

#### Pray for the persecuted and forgotten

On this day, many Christians of the Eastern tradition celebrate the feast of Saint Donatian and his companions, a group of lesserknown fifth-century martyrs driven out of North Africa by the Arian King Huneric, who persecuted a great many Trinitarians for their faith. Though we may not today face death for our confession, many of our brothers and sisters around the world do, and it is for them that we must pray with the help of Donatian and all who died for the name of Christ. Even more, we are tasked to help them materially if we can, since—as the Lord says—whatsoever we do for the least of his siblings, we do for him.

TODAY'S READINGS: Colossians 1:1-8; Luke 4:38-44 (433). "We have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love that you have for all the holy ones because of the hope reserved for you in heaven."

#### Thursday, Sep 07, 2023

#### School days, Golden Rule days

It's back-to-school season. Learning is foundational to our democracy and also to informed faith. In 2,000 years' time, Christianity has overcome countless heresies (a type of twisting of the belief) and accumulated many saints, martyrs, stories, and traditions. With school back in session, consider sending yourself to "school" to learn more about your own religion. Check out study materials from the U.S. Catholic bishops and formed.org, a program both individuals and parishes can use for faith formation. Make a choice to grow in wisdom and understanding.

TODAY'S READINGS: Colossians 1:9-14; Luke 5:1-11 (434). "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

#### Friday, Sep 08, 2023

#### A nativity set for the ages

The church officially celebrates three Nativities: the Nativity of Jesus, the Son of God (Christmas); the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist (24 June); and the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (8 September). These events tell us everything we need to know about God, faith, and the path to salvation. Through Jesus' Incarnation, we learn that God is with us—always and everywhere. Through John's witness we come to understand that we are not God—not even close—and we must prepare ourselves to welcome God's great goodness into our lives. And through Mary, we are shown the meaning of true discipleship—how to answer God's call and follow Christ through the joyful, sorrowful, and luminous mysteries of our lives in faith. Celebrate this dynamic trio by living in their light.

#### Give us this day some peace

"Racism has been part of the social fabric of America since its European colonization. Whether it be the tragic past of Native Americans, Mexicans, Puerto Ricans, or Blacks, the story is one of slavery, peonage, economic exploitation, brutal repression, and cultural neglect." This observation from the 1979 bishops' pastoral *Brothers and Sisters to Us* is why the church in the United States has established today as a "Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities" to promote healing of the racial divides of our nation. Make an honest examination of conscience regarding your thoughts, words, and deeds toward people of other ethnic and racial backgrounds.

Isn't it easy to relate to Peter? One moment Jesus announces Peter's deep communion with God the Father. The very next, when he rejects the logic of Jesus' suffering and death, Jesus calls Peter Satan. We Christians shouldn't be too shocked when we experience both spiritual highs and lows, when we perceive breathtaking contradictions in our hearts.

Like the great apostle, you and I are recipients of unfathomable graces. God dwells in us, calls his beloved children, and takes care of our every need. And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' cross-shaped plan for us.


