## LOVING CORRECTION

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

When we consider God's law, we discover that along with God's justice, there is something more: Love. St. Paul writes: "Love is the fulfillment of the law." Jesus' life is the fulfillment of the Law because He paid the sacrificial price of His Life to make it possible for us to be united with Him—with Love—forever.

Just as Jesus loves us, we too are called to love God with all of our minds, our hearts, and our souls, and we are to love our neighbor as ourselves. What does it mean to love our neighbor? It means that we have an obligation to pray for our family members, for our friends, and especially for those who cause problems or are difficult to love. We also have an obligation to fraternally correct others. If we witness a fellow Catholic who is not living according to the teachings of the Church, or someone who is doing something seriously or morally wrong, then we must lovingly remind this person of the truth and gently encourage this person to go to confession and return to follow God's commandments. Sometimes, for certain reasons it is not always possible to speak with the person. In this case, we can pray in his or her intention. In addition, if we see someone doing something wrong, then we may acknowledge that his/her actions are wrong and provide fraternal correction, but we must not judge the person's heart. For, only God truly knows the heart and the intentions of each person.

God commands us to love, and He gives us the grace to love if we ask Him for this. I would like to encourage each of you to offer Jesus your weaknesses and sins in the area of loving your neighbors and ask Him for the grace to see others through His eyes and look upon them with love.





## Flu Shots Can Protect Yourself & Your Community



While it remains important for people with comorbidities and those in high-risk groups to receive the flu vaccine people who are otherwise healthy should also make it a priority.

Everyone 6 months and older should get the flu vaccine yearly, says Dr. Petrikova, a doctor of family medicine at Aurora Health Center. Not only can it prevent a trip to ER or urgent care, by getting a vaccine, but it also protects against getting the virus altogether. Recovering from influenza can leave you vulnerable to other conditions because of increased inflammation in your system. Dr. Petrikova explains.

"It's really important for healthy people to get the influenza vaccine," says Dr. Gregory Sehring, a doctor of family medicine at Aurora Family Medicine. "There is a perspective if you're healthy and young that it may not be a huge threat, but it does affect everyone differently and the vaccine is the best way for everyone to protect themselves."

Not only does the flu vaccine prevent flu-related deaths and hospitalization, but it also lessens the severity should you get it. But the benefits extend beyond just individual protection. The flu vaccine also encourages herd immunity, which helps protect the community and those who cannot receive the vaccine because of allergies or too young.

"It is important to get a vaccine to protect others," Dr. Petrikova says. "When healthy person declines a vaccine, it creates a risk for others in their community."

The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat and sometimes lungs, resulting in symptoms like fever, chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, vomiting and diarrhea.

Because the flu virus evolves each year, it's important to receive the vaccine each year as it is modified to keep up with the changes of the virus as last year's vaccine may not protect you from this year's viruses, Dr. Petrikova says.

"More than ever, I would encourage everyone to get vaccinated, not just for influenza but the COVID vaccine as well, that's going to be our best protection during," Dr. Sehring says. "The more we can protect individuals through vaccination, the more it's going to keep people healthy and prevent overwhelming the healthcare system."

#### The long loneliness

"Church" means assembly: It is not good for us to be alone. Today's Suicide Prevention Day reminds us that loneliness is an unhealthy condition. More than 700,000 people die by suicide each year: about 132 a day in the United States. For every suicide, there are more than 20 attempts. Mental illness and substance abuse contribute to the crisis, but marginalized groups are at highest risk: migrants, indigenous people, those who identify as LGBTQ+, and prisoners. The feeling of alienation is real but also preventable. Call or text the crisis hotline at 988 to seek help for yourself or someone you love.

Today, the anniversary of the largest terrorist attack in American history, is a day to call to mind those who rushed in to help, at great cost. The first certified fatality of the attacks was Father Mychal Judge, Franciscan friar and New York City Fire Department chaplain, who rushed to the World Trade Center to help. During his life, he was known for ministering to the marginalized and for the words on a prayer card he often distributed: "Lord, take me where you want me to go. Let me meet who you want me to meet. Tell me what you want me to say. And keep me out of your way." Honor his legacy and make his humble prayer yours today.

TODAY'S READINGS: Colossians 1:24-2:3; Luke 6:6-11 (437). *"Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath rather than to do evil, to save life rather than to destroy it?"* 

#### Tuesday, Sep 12, 2023

#### On Earth we your children invoke your sweet name

Names are a big deal in the Bible. More than a moniker, the names of people—and God—capture, convey, and even conjure a being's very essence. It's why the Hebrews refused, out of respect, to speak God's holiest name and why "taking the Lord's name in vain" is forbidden. We see in biblical history how lifechanging experiences prompt a person's change of name, as when Sarai becomes Sarah and Saul becomes Paul. When Jesus talks of acting "in my name," he affirms a power and presence invoked by simply uttering his name. Today, heed Venerable Bruno Lanteri, founder of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary, who instructed: simply "think of Mary, call on Mary."

MEMORIAL OF THE MOST HOLY NAME OF MARY TODAY'S READINGS: Colossians 2:6-15; Luke 6:12-19 (438). "He chose Twelve, whom he also named Apostles: Simon, whom he named Peter, ..."

#### Wednesday, Sep 13, 2023

#### Always speak the words of light

With seemingly never-ending revelations of ministerial misconduct, today's feast of Saint John Chrysostom is a sight for sore eyes. The eminent fourth-century preacher and teacher— whose name is a transliteration of the Greek for "golden mouth"— was surely a product of his day. But he was also guided by the Holy Spirit, who inspired him to be baptized as an adult and denounce corruption in the church while serving as a priest and

later as archbishop of Constantinople. As we remember his legacy today, let's take courage to also stand for truth and against all that dishonors the call of the gospel.

MEMORIAL OF JOHN CHRYSOSTOM, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

TODAY'S READINGS: Colossians 3:1-11; Luke 6:20-26 (439). "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God."

#### Thursday, Sep 14, 2023

#### By the wood of the cross

Today's feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross goes back to early days in church history. Saint Helena was the mother of Emperor Constantine (the first Roman emperor to embrace the faith), and Helena is said to have found the actual crucifix of Jesus in Jerusalem in the fourth century, spurring significant devotion to the Holy Cross. This devotion has had staying power perhaps because it helps believers to reflect upon the saving power of Jesus' death. Today when something presents itself as a "cross" to you, take a few moments to contemplate the cross of Christ.

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS TODAY'S READINGS: Numbers 21:4b-9; Philippians 2:6-11; John 3:13-17 (638). "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish."

#### Friday, Sep 15, 2023

#### I feel your pain

Anyone who loves will experience sorrow. It can't be helped. When a loved one suffers, we suffer. The church looks to Our Lady of Sorrows during those difficult times. Mary has been pierced by the sword of sorrow many times, including the seven noted by tradition: The prophecy of Simeon, the Flight into Egypt, the lost child Jesus later found in the Temple, meeting Jesus on the road to Calvary, the Crucifixion, and Jesus' removal from the cross and his burial. Listen to the aching beauty of the Stabat Mater hymn recited each year on this memorial and know that you are not alone in your suffering. Mary's empathy is one of the saving graces of our faith. She knows how we feel, and sometimes that's all it takes to get us past the pain.

#### Care for the creation God entrusts to us

High above our heads the ozone layer of the stratosphere absorbs enough of the sun's deadly ultraviolet radiation to make possible life on Earth. But just a few decades ago an alarming depletion of the ozone layer generated worldwide concern over resulting increases in skin cancer, cataracts, and other health issues. These concerns led to the adoption of the Montreal Protocol in 1987, celebrated today, which bans the production of chemicals that cause ozone depletion. In his 2015 encyclical *Laudato si'*, Pope Francis applauds the Protocol for helping to protect the Earth, our common home. What can you do for our Earth today? #### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

September 10, 2023 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

What are you supposed to do about the bad behavior of the people around you? You know who I'm talking about. That family member, friend, coworker, or acquaintance who is quite immoral. On this front there are two lively options in our culture: bash the person to others (probably online) or pretend everything's fine. The former damages the person. The latter ignores reality. What to do?

Jesus' strategy in the Gospel of Matthew is as wise as it is difficult: go directly to the person, and then gradually expand the circle of intervention. Simple, often effective, and hard. But what we often miss is the context of the Lord's strategy, "If your brother sins against you..." Notice the italicized words. Is the person in a Christian familial bond with you? And was the action in question against you? If so, proceed with the plan. Fine. But how often we fret over the sins of those who either aren't our spiritual siblings or have done nothing directly to us. This is not an invitation to ignore injustice in the world. Rather, we should build bonds of fraternal love, and carefully discern when and how others' sins are indeed our concern. Sometimes they are. Other times — frequently, perhaps they simply are not.
