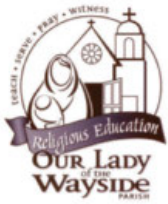

PEACE THROUGH FORGIVENESS

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven."

Jesus makes it clear that there is no limit to giving and receiving forgiveness. When a wife loves her husband and when she forgives him when he does something wrong, and when a husband sees that his wife forgives him, their love can become even deeper and intense. God permits difficulties and even sin in our lives with the hope that they will deepen our faith in Him. He pushes us to make a continual choice—to choose Him, to return and ask for forgiveness. The dynamism of faith is evident in trials that polarize us. They lead to either a crisis or an intensification of faith, which should always grow and increase. Jesus' mercy is our rescue from the chaos. When our lives are chaotic, when we are helpless and fall into sin, and when we do not know what to do, when we suffer and are confused, Jesus invites us to ask for His Merciful Love in the sacrament of Confession as often as we need. He invites us to seek His forgiveness. For when we are forgiven, when we experience God's mercy, we also experience peace and are brought closer to Him.

The Holy Spirit wants to create in us new hearts that will not be disturbed by chaos—hearts that will find peace and security in God's merciful Love. This weekend I would like to invite you to pray for those who seek to repay evil with evil, that they may experience God's forgiveness and have a change of heart.

We pray, too, for ourselves and the members of the Church and our families, that our own hearts may become ever more merciful first by being open to God's mercy and love.

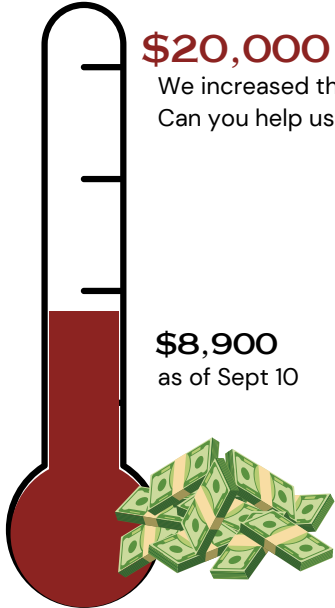

People with These Characteristics are Happiest

We all want, and deserve, to be happy. Whether it's feeling satisfied at work or in your personal life, a study shows that people with certain personality traits, known as the Big 5, are consistently happier throughout their lives.

Kelly M. Larson, nurse practitioner and behavioral health specialist at Aurora Behavioral Health in Wauwatosa, Wis., explains what the Big 5 traits are and how to exemplify them day-to-day:

1. **Openness:** Being open-minded, creative and having a broad range of interests. If you are open, you can also deal better with change.
2. **Conscientiousness:** Being organized, dependable and wanting to have achievements in life. Your friends and family may also see you as a reliable person.
3. **Extraversion:** Being able to see the bright side or experience positive emotions. This can also include being social with those in your life.
4. **Agreeableness:** Showing kindness, being considerate and helping others in need.
5. **Emotional stability:** You approach life's issues in a balanced way. For example, being able to think about a situation before responding rashly.



Larson says she has seen this phenomenon in her practice in a variety of ways, which reinforces the importance of seeking out a mental health provider if needed.

"I have seen this when depression lifts and patients are able to be more social and experience positive emotions, also known as extraversion," Larson says. "With depression, patients tend to isolate themselves from family or friends, and this can be detrimental to mental health. When I see patients become more social and see happiness in more of life's moments, there's an increase in life, social, and even work satisfaction."

A few other areas Larson mentions you should focus on are sleep and self-awareness. When people are experiencing better quality sleep, there's an increase in emotional stability, so you can better cope with issues that may arise and keep your mood more stable.

According to Larson, those that see a provider tend to also have better insight and understanding into their mental well-being. This increases life satisfaction because you have better control of not only how you respond to stressors but can have more control over the way you may interact with others.

But what if you aren't born with naturally high extraversion or conscientiousness?

Larson explains that people can change their traits, and things are not static.

"People can work towards happiness or satisfaction by doing hobbies they love, seeing kindness and positivity in others, and even being open to change and possibilities," Larson says. "Through my line of work, I also see these changes with medication and therapy."

Some other ways to boost satisfaction in your life, regardless of personality, could be something as simple as self-care, Larson says. Go for daily walks, take a nice bath, bake a treat, for example.

"I also think setting and accomplishing goals, no matter how big or small, can boost satisfaction," Larson shares.

Make of your life a mission of peace

In an address to the World Council of Churches in Evanston, Illinois in 1954, Dag Hammarskjöld, the second United Nations secretary-general (1953-61), referred to churches as the "guardians of ... the deepest beliefs and the loftiest dreams ..." of humanity. He died in a plane crash on this date while on a peace mission in the Congo and is the only person to receive the Nobel Peace Prize posthumously. Pope Francis praised him in 2015 for giving his life for "reconciliation among peoples." May the example and inspiration of Hammarskjöld, and the many who work to end conflict in the world, unite the people of God in their pursuit.

The real magic of relics

The significance of saintly relics is best understood in light of basic Catholic teaching: Relics aren't talismans born of superstition, nor are they magical souvenirs from worship-worthy saints. Moreover, relics deserve the same basic respect as other human remains. This is key because, historically, relics have been the subject of misunderstanding and abuse, everything from pilgrims who would steal bits of saintly bodies to Martin Luther's objection when relics were sold and hoarded like baubles. God alone works miracles and is worthy of worship. Saints merely agree to be the conduit—in obedience to Divine Love—sometimes paying the price with their martyrs' blood. Consider: The real miracle of Januarius' blood might be that he was willing to sacrifice it.

Be inspired to broaden your concern

On this day in 1918, at the age of 58, Mary Theresa Dudzik entered into eternal life. She accomplished a lot of good in her time on Earth. After immigrating to Chicago from Poland at 21, she would invite poor elderly women and girls to her home. "I felt the misery and suffering of others, and it seemed to me that I could not love Jesus, or even expect Heaven if I were concerned only about myself," she wrote. Dudzik started the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago in 1893, the first order of religious women founded in

Chicago. The community devoted itself to aiding the elderly and those in need. She received the honorary title of "Mother" in 1948 and is now a candidate for sainthood. Learn more about Venerable Mary Theresa Dudzik and her heroic virtue.

Witness value

When the name Saint Matthew comes up, many people recall him as the tax collector apostle who wrote the Gospel of Matthew. Modern scholarship has challenged the belief that Matthew the apostle wrote the gospel with his name on it, and other details of Saint Matthew's death by martyrdom cannot be definitively proven. Maybe having precision about all aspects of Matthew's life is not the most important factor in this feast, however. The church celebrates Matthew for being a faithful apostle and evangelist, things to which every Christian can aspire. Does your life evangelize, that is, bear witness to your belief?

Delve into fresh spiritual classics

The Spirit dwells in each of us and is expressed in myriad ways. The church treasures this rich diversity as "refractions of the one pure light of the Holy Spirit," as the Catechism of the Catholic Church puts it. Too often erased historically, the experiences of women haven't always been allowed to shine as brightly, however. And so we lift up writers such as Monica Coleman, Gloria Anzaldúa, Mary Oliver, Jung Eun Sophia Park, and Phyllis Tickle, renowned spirituality author who died on this date in 2015. Read one of these or another author whose particular "refraction" resonates with your own.

The essentials of sainthood

Controversy shadowed the life of the mystical Padre Pio, as Pius of Pietrelcina was known. He was said to bear the stigmata, or wounds of Christ, though detractors claimed he manufactured the wounds with carbolic acid. However one views such claims and counter claims, the undeniable fact is that he was a compassionate counselor to the thousands who came to see him during his lifetime, a tireless servant who lived a simple life. At Padre Pio's canonization Mass in 2002, Saint John Paul II said: "The life and mission of Padre Pio testify that difficulties and sorrows, if accepted with love, transform themselves into a privileged journey of holiness, which opens the person toward a greater good, known only to the Lord." You don't have to be a mystic or stigmatist to mirror the ministry of Christ in your own life—all you need is a kind heart and generous spirit.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

September 17, 2023

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was in second grade, my prized possession was a metal Star Wars-themed lunch box. After school one day, another student ripped it from my hands. I helplessly watched in horror as my classmate threw it to the ground and violently stomped it into an unrecognizable heap of junk. I came home covered in tears of shame and rage. After a few months, I never thought about it again... until I was almost thirty years old and on a retreat to prepare for ordination to the priesthood.

That childhood memory — and the attendant outrage — came back afresh. My spiritual director helped me in the process of acknowledging that I was angry because that kid owed me my lunch box. Then she helped me, through the grace of Jesus, to forgive the debt. Almost immediately I felt a new peace. I was amazed that I hadn't forgotten what I had lost, even from years before. Aren't we human beings simply amazing at remembering what people owe us?

We see this week in Jesus' parable a servant who is forgiven much but then commands another servant: "Pay back what you owe!" He can't forget or let go of how he was wronged. He *remembers* — and he becomes a monster because of it. If only he had remembered not only the debts owed to him, but also his greater debt owed to — and forgiven by — his master. It's natural for us to remember what others owe us. But when we contextualize those offenses in Jesus' mercy toward us and them, we're free to be merciful like the Master and less like a monster who never forgets.
