# WHAT IS RADICAL SOLIDARITY?

In reaction to the overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, some areas of the country now protect the child in the womb, while others are doing all they can to increase access to abortion. At this critical moment, we have been entrusted with new opportunities and new responsibilities to build a civilization of authentic love.

Our culture claims to offer women so-called "choice," but ultimately abandons mothers to make tragic and painful decisions alone. We must lead the way in showing the alternative: "In firmly rejecting 'pro-choice' it is necessary to become courageously 'pro woman,' promoting a choice that is truly in favor of women."

The only honest stance in these cases, is that of radical solidarity with the woman. It is not right to leave her alone." Experience shows that when a mother is supported, "she is even capable of heroism."

Radical solidarity compels us to come alongside vulnerable mothers in profound friendship, compassion, and support for both them and their preborn children. It requires us to address the fundamental challenges that lead an expectant mother to believe she is unable to welcome the child God has entrusted to her. We must do all we can to provide mothers, children, and families with the support they need to flourish.

#### THE GREATEST GIFT

25thSunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

It is tempting to think like the laborers in the Gospel that God is more generous with others than with me. This temptation arises when we desire the wrong thing: what God gives instead of God Himself. What the laborers who had worked all day in the field failed to see was the same thing that the older brother in the story

of the Prodigal Son was blind to: they had the far greater gift to be with the landowner all day.

When we die, our reward for following Christ will not be wages or wealth, land or goods; it will be union with God.

This is our aim. This is what will bring us true happiness. And all the circumstances of our lives are intended by God to bring about this union and to draw us ever closer to Him. So the job that you did not get, the misunderstandings that occur between spouses, a difficult child who rebels and becomes addicted to drugs, and the next great thing you cannot attain—these are all permitted by God so that we can seek Him. He is our end. And if we keep this always in mind, we will see that God is always generous with each of us—so generous, in fact, that He tailors even the smallest details our lives to us (while respecting our free will) in order to guide us to Him.

So, when the temptation to be jealous or envious of others arises, say to yourself: "Lord, I have you. What more do I really need?"



How old do you need to be to get a flu shot? 3 years and older

Hosted by: Walgreen's Pharmacy

\*\*Covid-19, Pneumonia, Shingles and High Dose Flu (for those over 65) vaccines are available.

**Cost:** Medicare B and most private insurances **cover the <u>cost of the shot</u>**. If you do not have insurance, the cost of the shot is \$45.00.

**Consent Form:** To minimize waiting time in line, we **strongly encourage** you to print and bring a completed **Vaccine Consent Form**. Click the following link, or cut and paste it into your browser to access this form: <a href="https://bit.ly/2ZqtvOW">https://bit.ly/2ZqtvOW</a>.

**Please bring with you:** Both your prescription card and insurance card in case the prescription plan does not cover the flu shot, they will bill your medical plan. Also, if you are on Medicare, please bring your card. Walgreen's will process all claims to the insurance (after the shot is given) at their store and contact the patient directly if there is a copay.

If you are covered by a HMO insurance plan, please check with them to see if they will cover the cost before coming for your flu shot.

If you are paying out of pocket, they will take only cash or check.

# What to Expect at Your Annual Checkup

#### SEPTEMBER IS HEALTHY AGING MONTH



Everyone should have an annual physical for overall health, but what exactly are doctors looking for and what can you expect at a checkup?

While in some ways that can depend on the patient, there are certain tests that are standard during a yearly checkup, explains Dr. Katarzyna Scigacz, an Advocate Medical Group internal medicine physician.

And it's important not to skip those annual visits with a primary care provider, Dr. Scigacz says. Having a checkup every year provides your doctor with a better picture of your overall health, offers the perfect time to update any medications and discuss annual vaccinations like a flu shot, and can even catch a health issue early, she says.

"Oftentimes, if we can identify something in its early stage, or if someone is at risk, we can help mitigate," she says.

Here's what to expect each year at your checkup, according to Dr. Scigacz:

- **Blood pressure:** This important reading measures the pressure that is put on your artery walls. Some people only get a blood pressure reading when they visit a doctor. Others may have to take regular readings for certain health conditions.
- **Weight:** Even if jumping on the scale isn't your favorite thing, your doctor needs to know if it's creeping up, or down.
- **Medical history:** If you have a family history of a disease or condition, doctors will know what to screen for and you will know more about your risks. For example, prediabetes doesn't have symptoms and can soon turn into diabetes. Knowing family history can determine appropriate precautions and screenings.
- **Blood tests:** Doctors will order a series of standard blood tests to look for abnormalities, but also to determine your baseline. That can include labs that show thyroid, kidney and liver function, along with a complete blood count.
- **Mental health:** More providers are now screening for depression. Sometimes patients won't volunteer information related to their mood unless they're directly asked.
- Immunization: Doctors will recommend a flu shot, especially during certain times of the year. Next weekend, September 30 & October 1, OLW is hosting a Flu shot clinic, see bulletin or website for more details.

Dr. Scigacz says doctors could also include other tests or screenings, depending on a patient's age, gender and other factors. That can include recommending a mammogram, offering an STI screening or other tests. Many also take the opportunity to remind patients to seek out dental and vision screenings, she adds.

The Season of Creation, an annual ecumenical celebration of prayer and action for our common home, began on September 1 (World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and ends on October 4 (the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi). There is still more than a week left for you, your family, your cohort of friends, your school, and your parish to renew your relationship with the Creator and with creation, through celebration, conversion, and commitment together. How? Pray. Read Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato si'. Coordinate a cleanup project or other sustainability effort. Use your voice and advocate for climate justice. Best idea yet? Come up with one no one has thought of!

#### Freely share the gifts you've been given

Cosmas and Damian were legendary. Many churches have been built in their honor, and their names make the short list of saints enshrined in Eucharistic Prayer I, used during the Mass. During the final years of Rome's brutal persecution of Christians, the twin physicians lived in Syria—then an eastern province of the Roman Empire. Not only were they gifted healers, but they refused to charge for their services. As they explained, "We treat the infirm by the power of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and take no payment for rendering aid to the sick, because our Lord commanded His disciples, 'Freely have you received, freely give.'" How have you been blessed by God, and how can you share that with others?

MEMORIAL OF COSMAS AND DAMIAN, MARTYRS TODAY'S READINGS: Ezra 6:7-8, 12b, 14-20; Luke 8:19-21 (450). "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it."

#### Wednesday, Sep 27, 2023

#### Now on tour

Today is World Tourism Day. According to the United Nations, the tourism sector employs one in every 10 people on Earth, and millions more benefit economically from tourism, though the wealth generated isn't always shared equitably. For tourists, exploring new places and enjoying favorite ones can be exhilarating—but bad behavior can ruin a trip. Keeping an attitude of openness and gratitude, as well as respect for local people and customs while on

vacation or a tour can transform the experience. Archbishop Rino Fisichella of the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization wrote in anticipation of today's observance, "A tourism that respects the person and the environment opens the way to perceiving the goodness of the Father who reaches out to everyone with his love." It's hard to imagine a better souvenir than that.

#### Thursday, Sep 28, 2023

#### Lighten the load

You may have heard the old English Christmas song about a Bohemian king who became Saint Wenceslaus, in part because of his great charity. The most famous tale from the charitable king's life was recorded in the carol "Good King Wenceslaus." The king helps a poor man keep from freezing by trodding a path in the snow for him, easing the man's journey to shelter. It ends with an admonishment to do likewise for anyone who suffers and "[you] shall yourselves find blessing." Do a favor for someone in need today, and like Wenceslaus, you will find blessing.

#### Friday, Sep 29, 2023

#### **Entertaining angels**

Care for strangers has always been a strong imperative in Christianity. Yet in today's highly politicized environment, it is challenging to reach out to strangers who some have deemed to be threats—people like refugees and other marginalized communities. Scripture is clear: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." Angels? It's far easier to see angels from the safety of a holy card or a statue. But think for a moment and see if you have at some point encountered an angel through the presence of a stranger.

FEAST OF MICHAEL, GABRIEL, AND RAPHAEL, ARCHANGELS TODAY'S READINGS: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 or Revelation 12:7-12ab; John 1:47-51 (647). "How do you know me?"

#### Saturday, Sep 30, 2023

#### Christianity, by the book

As early Christianity distanced itself from Judaism, Christians began to lose touch with their faith's deep Jewish roots. Saint Jerome (born around 340) helped to reestablish the link. He learned Hebrew from a Christian monk who had converted from Judaism. More unusual for the time, he studied with Jewish rabbis to gain a better understanding of Hebrew scripture. He then spent 15 years producing the foundational Latin translation of the Hebrew Bible, which we know as the Old Testament. He later said, "For if, as Paul says, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God, and if the man who does not know Scripture does not know the power and wisdom of God, then ignorance of Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Crack open the Good Book today, in honor of a key figure who helped shape it.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

September 24, 2023 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Once I gave my three-year-old niece a certain toy for Christmas. When she opened it, she was happy. Shortly thereafter her five-year old sister opened another present from me: the same toy, along with some play jewelry. The three-year-old cried out: "That's not fair! Why'd she get the jewelry, too?!"

Let's face it: there's something about God's grace in our religion which bugs us. We love to look at others' blessings and cry out: "That's not fair!" Catholicism is not fair in the sense that it is a religion founded on God's grace which is unmerited favor. God pours his mercy, love, and divine life upon us not because we're good but because He is infinitely good.

If you think the "not fair" quality of grace is easy to accept, consider how typically angry we get when we hear the parable of the workers who get paid way more than they deserve. The hyper-generous landowner says to the indignant hard workers, "Are you envious because I am generous?" Well, yes, they are, and so are we! Therefore, we have to reckon with this painful truth in order to move into the divine sphere of gifts, which is the world of Christ and his Church. Then we are able to move beyond a tit-for-tat world and into one where gifts are poured forth on those who don't deserve it — namely, upon


