




In addition, and most notably, this past year we completed the Renew my Church process. This is great news, which is due in large part to the many parishioners who have generously given their time, talents, and treasure to ensure that our community not only survives, but thrives.

# Faith Formation.

The religious education program (REP) expanded its class options for the 2nd year in a row this year. Providing flexibility to foster their faith, OLW began offering online home study for Confirmation prep students and continuing to offer a family based home study program to grades 1-6.


REP continues to offer an in person program for grades 1-8 on Tuesday evenings.

Our Youth Ministry keeps teens connected to their faith. Every Sunday evening around 30 high school students participate in Peer Ministry.

Children's Ministries include

- Scouting Programs
- Children's Liturgy of the Word (during 9:30 mass)
- Monthly Family Masses
- Faith Into Action
- Little Saints
- Vacation Bible School.

OLW has been proud to host Totus Tuus, a popular diocese-sponsored summer camp experience for students in first grade through high school for the past two years. This has been an important opportunity for our youth to **grow their faith.** 











# The Sacraments.

Sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, through which Divine life is given. There are seven Sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Matrimony, and Holy Orders.





Celebrating sacraments helps us to strengthen our parish community. As a faith community, we take great pride in celebrating sacraments with our members throughout every stage of their lives.

#### In 2022-2023 we proudly celebrated:

- 94 Baptisms
- 70 First Holy Communions
- 69 Confirmations
- 11 Marriages
- 90 Funerals
- 82 Anointings
- 5 RCIA Candidates

These meaningful celebrations have brought us closer to God and helped us grow together as a faith-based community.

The OLW campus requires annual maintenance and repair in order to ensure the buildings are safe and properly functioning to serve our community.

During FY 22-23, through a combination of OLW parish fund and generous donations from parishioners for specific projects, we were able to complete the following improvement projects:

- Renovated and repaired the Rectory kitchen
- Installed new signage across the entire campus
- Repaired and repainted the parking lot
- Repaired HVAC systems
- · Renovated the rectory patio
- Painted the Parish Center and railings around campus
- Masonry repairs on Parish Center
- Renovated Lower level washroom in Elementary School

# Capital Improvements.

OLW is fortunate to have a large campus with five buildings providing spaces to worship and grow as a faith community and school. Like the parish, the buildings on campus are nearly 70 years old.

The Archdiocese has completed a full campus facilities assessment and provided a 5-year road map of repairs that our campus will need.

Capital Campaign planning will kick off in early 2024 to allow OLW to raise the needed funds to meet the repair and maintenance requirements.

#### Fiscal Year 2023 Financial Performance Highlights:

Parish income increased by 3% primarily from increased tuition and fees as Sunday and Holy Day Collections only increased 1% from FY22.

OLW is not immune to rising costs in the current inflationary economy. As a result, parish expenses increased by 5% compared to FY22 primarily from an increase in Salaries and Benefits.

# For the combined church and school operations, the operating loss was \$154K, which follows the prior year loss of \$61K.

Simply stated: Financial performance that results in an Operating Loss is not sustainable for our parish.


## **Parish Financial Performance**

#### Fiscal Year 2023 INCOME Details:

- Sunday, Holy Day and Holiday Collections increased 1% for FY 2023
- Consistent with market trends- Interest and Investment Income, albeit a small portion of our income, **decreased** by 55%

**OVERALL Income is failing to keep up with expenses** 

#### Fiscal Year 2023 Expense Increase Explanations:





- Salaries increased by 2.5% while employee benefits were restored to their pre-Covid level, and health care insurance costs rose along with participation rate, leading to an 8% rise in employment related costs.
- Increased maintenance costs, mostly caused by deferred maintenance, for items such as leaky roof, repairing the mortar on the buildings and renovating the bathroom in the elementary school building are another cause of increased expenses.

### **Financial Stability at OLW Parish**

Call to Action

We're thrilled that to this point our parish has remained debt-free and continues to enjoy financial stability. However, with the continual decline in offertory collections, we are concerned the financial strength of the parish will weaken. As expected, we are evaluating our budget and operations to reduce costs where possible.

Unfortunately, expense reduction alone won't be enough.

To Maintain Financial Stability we need YOU! Please prayerfully consider how your family can increase your support to our parish.

### **Offertory Collections.**

The total number of Parish Families that donate annually Increased in FY '23 from 907 to 951.

This represents a 4.58% increase in families donating. Yet- Parish Offertory Collections are down over \$200,000 annually since FY19.

Our Lady of the Wayside is a Community. A Parish built on relationships with God and with each other.

The Ministries at Our Lady of the Wayside provide opportunities to grow in faith, fellowship and service for members of our parish of **all ages.** 

#### A small sampling of the OLW Ministries include:

- **CFM** Through the dynamics of small group discussions held in members' homes, CFM members come together to learn, grow and support each other in becoming and living as the people of God in everyday life.
- **Bible Studies-** Parishioners meet weekly Friday mornings at 9:30 am in the Cabrini Room of our Parish Center to reflect on the Scripture readings for the coming Sunday and to explore their implications for daily life
- Art and Environment- A group of parishioners who help plan, design and execute the Worship Space Environment for the various seasons of the Liturgical Year.
- Women of Wayside- A large community made up of small faith groups who meet once per month.
- Men's Golf League- OLW Men's golf plays Wednesday afternoons at Arlington Lakes Golf Course from April through September.
- St. Mark's Ministry -sponsors a monthly food drive, the second Sunday of every month, to benefit the Food Pantry at our sharing parish.
- St Vincent DePaul Ministry hosts an annual 5K Run & Walk to promote community and raise funds for those in need of life's basic necessities.
- Live Stream Dream Team- Streams daily masses, funerals, weddings and weekend masses for people who cannot attend OLW in person

# Our School.

#### ENRICHING MINDS. FOSTERING FAITH. EXPANDING TALENTS.

For several years now, parents, students and teachers in the Archdiocese of Chicago are asked to take a Catholic identity survey to measure how well each school is performing to meet the directive of St John Paul II – "The mission of a Catholic school is the integral formation of students so that they may be true to their condition as Christ's disciples..."

100% of students agree - God is present in my life

99% of students agree - Prayers and Masses at school help me know and love Jesus.

98% of students agree - At my school, I have opportunities to help others through meaningful works of service and care.

94% of students agree - Teachers help me see how Catholic faith should help me make day to day decisions.

99% of parents agree - I encounter teachers and staff witnessing the Catholic faith in the interaction with others.

Fostering Faith is one part of the school's mission and based on these answers, OLW School is meeting that aspect of the mission. As the largest ministry of this vibrant parish, OLW School is highly engaged in raising and educating the future of our faith.







#### Enriching Minds

OLW offers a rigorous academic program and OLW alumni consistently are placed into honors classes in high school.

STEM is part of the K-5 curriculum, helping our students learn vital skills such as critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving.

Our small class sizes allow our teachers to really know each student individually.

### Our Lady of the Wayside School Funds.

Our school is the largest ministry of the parish. The Parish's investment in the school allows it to set competitive and reasonable tuition rates.

Tuition and fees is the largest revenue source for the school, but that only covers about 85% of the school budget. The school's fundraising goal is \$180,000 yearly to bridge the gap between tuition and fees and the full operating expenses. We rely on donations from current and former parents, alumni, parishioners, family and friends, and community partners.

In 2022-23, the Family School Association (FSA) contributed over \$130,000 to help bridge the gap. Their fundraising efforts were vital and appreciated.

All donations to the Annual Fund help the administration provide resources and support to enrich the student experience. This includes: the school counselor, curriculum coordinator, teacher stipends & reimbursements for classroom supplies, among other needs outside the normal operating budget.

In the 22-23 school year, sponsorship fundraising also supported the Annual Fund. Sponsor logos were on banners hung in the gym and also were shown in the different school event ticketing websites. This is now a yearly fundraising effort for the school to support the Annual Fund.

Other fundraising for the Annual Fund comes from #GivingTuesday, matching donations, an Annual Alumni appeal, and from directed donations.

Our school is very lucky to have an Endowment Fund. The OLW School Endowment Fund was established in 1999 to perpetuate, partially support, and uphold the educational work of the School. Many alumni parents support the Endowment Fund because they understand the long-term benefits of securing OLW's future. This is a restricted fund, and only interest income can be used.

In the 2022-23 school year, the OLWSEF Board approved a disbursement for renovation to an elementary school bathroom.

#### Last things

November's a good time to consider our responsibilities to those who depend on us and may be nearing the end of life. (Or perhaps we're getting long in years ourselves.) We know our social obligations: Write a will, make our medical preferences known to doctors and family members. But Catholics have other duties too. Offering forgiveness and being forgiven are vital issues at the end of life—and every year of life. We have to ensure the sacraments are available to the elderly and the sick. How vigils, funerals, and burials are conducted matters to us. Reflect on these things now.

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 6:12-16; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Matthew 25:1-13 (154). "Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.""

#### Monday, Nov 13, 2023

#### The underestimated shall be esteemed

Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini was born Maria Francesca in Italy in 1850, the youngest of 13 children. She was small and had poor health. Because of her frailty, she was rejected by the religious community she wanted to join. She founded her own order and dreamed of becoming a missionary to the Far East like the saint whose name she took. But the pope sent her west instead, to the United States—and she founded 67 missionary institutions to serve the sick and poor from New York to Chicago to Los Angeles. Nine years after her death, her religious institute, the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, became missionaries in China. Don't underestimate the power of God or yourself!

#### Tuesday, Nov 14, 2023

#### Put your hope in order

As we inch toward Advent, it's good to revisit the theme of hope. Consider this, from Pope Francis two years ago today, for the World Day of the Poor: "The hope born of the Gospel has nothing to do with a passive expectation that things may be better tomorrow, but with making God's promise of salvation concrete today.... Christian hope is not the naïve, even adolescent, optimism of those who hope that things may change [and] in the meantime go on with life; it has to do with building daily, by concrete gestures, the kingdom of love, justice, and fraternity that Jesus inaugurated." Or as Italian Bishop Don Tonio Bello would say, "We cannot be content to hope. We have to organize hope." How will you organize hope today?

TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 2:23–3:9; Luke 17:7-10 (492). "Those who trust in him shall understand truth, and the faithful shall abide with him in love."

#### Wednesday, Nov 15, 2023

#### Live a life of great service

The great Dominican friar Albertus Magnus died on this day in 1280, after a long life of dedication to the church as a scholar, scientist, and briefly the bishop of Regensburg. He shunned excess and was known as a mediator—which, in his day, was a complicated matter, given the ongoing Crusades. We, too, live in an age of war, economic inequality, and general spiritual laxity. We owe it to ourselves to look to the German Dominican for inspiration to live a more rigorous life of spiritual seeking, so as to find lasting solutions to the problems of our day.

#### Thursday, Nov 16, 2023

#### Extraordinary sacrifice in ordinary clothing

It's easy to think that martyrs were people completely different from us, but Christian courage doesn't always have a cinematic face. Father Ignacio Ellacuría, S.J., five other Jesuits, and their housekeeper and her daughter were murdered in El Salvador. Ellacuría and his fellow Jesuits had publicly defended human rights and ministered to poor people in spite of intense government repression. May their dedication to justice inspire us to do our part in creating a more just world order that protects those who speak truth to power.

TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 7:22b–8:1; Luke 17:20-25 (494). "For behold, the Kingdom of God is among you."

#### Friday, Nov 17, 2023

#### A delicate matter

The Catholic Church identifies well over a dozen saints as patrons of lacemaking, lace workers, and related textile workers. Saint Elizabeth of Hungary is among these patrons who possibly became associated with lacemaking as it is a craft often seen as "immaculate" and virtuous, much like the saints themselves. But lacemakers and other artisan workers also often sat on the edge of poverty. These were the people who benefitted from the kind deeds of the likes of Saint Elizabeth, who roamed the streets near her castle passing out alms for the poor and tending to the sick. Take a moment to consider the artisans and craftspeople of our own time who could benefit from your patronage.

#### Saturday, Nov 18, 2023

#### Let freedom ring

In 1818, when Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne came from France to the United States, she was dismayed that slavery still operated "in the land of the free." Yet, when she opened foundations in Louisiana, the sisters were given slaves along with their households. In 1830 she accepted a slave in lieu of a tuition payment. She insisted that slaves in the household be treated well, arguing, "They have the same soul as we; they have been redeemed by the same blood and received into the same Church," but, like all of us, she was clearly enmeshed in social structures in need of redemption. Work for a society that truly is free at last.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

November 12, 2023 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lately I've been enjoying the deep meaning of Eastern icons. I love how they express a tapestry of meaning in a way that can surpass the written or spoken word. Today's parable of the ten virgins from Jesus is a good example. Try googling "wise and foolish virgins icon" and you'll see an image of how our Christ meets our heart's deepest needs if we attend to him with the proper attitude.

I'm serious. Take a moment to google and look at it. See how it depicts the risen Jesus behind a closed door with the five wise virgins with lighted lamps. He gazes with them toward the five foolish and lamp-less virgins, symbolizing the outward looking of divine love for the lost. Moreover, the wedding feast is no ordinary one. It takes place in a walled city and garden, indicating it's a new Jerusalem and a return to Eden. The table isn't typical, either. It's a Eucharistic feast. Now we see that the door in Jesus' parable is the way into the church, where Christ is the new light burning amidst the dark midnight of this world.

The richness continues. We notice, too, that the foolish virgins look exactly the same as the wise ones in their clothes, hair, and expressions. The only difference is they departed to buy oil and now they are sadly excluded. We often act like consumers in the marketplace to fulfill our need for love and mercy. We'll always end up disappointed if we shop around. Jesus sums up the moral of the story this way: **"Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."** Watch, remain, don't spiritually shop. It is always better to quietly remain close to the Eucharistic community of the Church, even if we feel like our oil has run out. This week let's consider placing the icon of the wise and foolish virgins on our phone lock screen or computer desktop to help us remember to stay close to him, especially when life feels dark.

#### SACRED LITURGY:
