Adoration – make a Lenten commitment



You may have seen this statistic - In 2019, a study by the Pew Research Center reported that only a third of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of Christ. Maybe we shouldn't be surprised by this information given the full complexity of the Eucharist - that

through the power and grace of God, the bread and wine is transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. This very real presence of Christ begins at the moment of consecration and endures until it is consumed.

To help Catholics not only better understand the Real Presence of Christ but to develop a deeper love for the Eucharist, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has established a National Eucharistic Revival. This is a multiyear effort involving catechesis (knowing about God) and evangelization (knowing and loving God). This effort started in 2022 and will conclude in 2025.

At the parish level we will be offering additional opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration during Lent. Forty hours of Eucharistic Adoration will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 14 at 8:00 pm and continue through Noon Friday February 16. And on five Saturdays during Lent, from February 17 to March 16 there will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament beginning one-hour prior to 5pm Mass, concluding just before Mass begins. Additional opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration will continue on Tuesday evenings beginning at 6:30 pm and on Wednesday mornings from 9:00 am to 10:00 am. I hope you make time to spend an hour with the Lord during this Lenten season.

Lenten Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on **Ash Wednesday** and on all **Fridays** of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on **Ash Wednesday** and on **Good Friday** by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 60.

Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our 40-day Lenten journey. Lent is a season of reflection, prayer, repentance, and sacrifice – a time to prepare our hearts and minds to walk beside Jesus into the barren desert and, ultimately, into Jerusalem to experience His passion and death.

This Lent, I invite all Our Lady of the Wayside parishioners to prepare your hearts to receive Jesus' abundant love and limitless mercy. I encourage you to make a strong Lenten commitment to participate in the many spiritual growth opportunities we will be offering, including Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross (with soup beforehand), praying the Rosary, receiving the Holy Eucharist and Sacrament of Reconciliation, and by attending the Multi-parish Mission and the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit. I would also like to call your attention five changes we are making for Lent this year.

- 1. Stations of the Cross will be led by lay people representing OLW ministries, including CFM, the (TMIY) Men's Group, the Women of Wayside and the Knights of Columbus.
- 2. The Rosary lead by the Knights of Columbus will be recited at 11 am on Sundays, immediately preceding the 11:30 am Mass.
- 3. As part of the National Eucharistic Revival, **40 Hours of Adoration** will begin on Wednesday, February 14, at 8 pm. **Adoration** will also be offered each Saturday of Lent at 4 pm, immediately preceding the 5 pm Vigil Mass.
- 4. Following Communion at all Masses, we will observe a **Period of "Sacred Silence"** to provide parishioners with silent time for prayer and reflection.
- 5. Deacon Jerry Brennan will share **Lenten Reflections**, in place of my regular column, in our Sunday Bulletins.

Let us remember that the joy of Christ's resurrection experienced on Easter Sunday is amplified by how closely we walked with Jesus on His Lenten journey. I encourage you, my brothers and sisters, to walk closely with Jesus into the desert these 40 days of Lent, to prepare your hearts and minds so that you may fully rejoice in His glorious Resurrection this Easter.

THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD

Our Lady of the Wayside — Fr. Mackin Center, March 2–5 and **SPEAKER MICHAEL O'NEILL**, March 5



The Eucharistic Miracles of the World is coming to Our Lady of the Wayside and can be seen in the Fr. Mackin Center from March 2 through March 5. The exhibit is a well-documented presentation of Eucharistic miracles that have taken place throughout the ages in various countries around the world. They are recognized by the Catholic Church as truly worthy of belief. The exhibit was created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15-year-old Roman Catholic from Milan, Italy, who was beatified on October 10, 2020. It was his desire for the exhibit to draw others to love the Blessed Sacrament. The exhibit is

comprised of poster-size panels, each featuring a Eucharistic miracle with historic documentation, photos and illustrations. By means of the these panels, one can "virtually visit" places where the miracles took place.



Michael O'Neill, author, EWTN host, and creator of the popular miracle hunting website MiracleHunter.com, will talk about the Eucharistic Miracles on Tuesday, March 5 in the Church. He will show a 20 minute video during his presentation that he produced for EWTN. This will take place at 1 pm in the afternoon and then again at 7 pm, following the 6 pm evening Mass. There will be a book signing in the Gathering Space adjacent to the Church, after both of Mr. O'Neil's presentations. Books may be purchased with cash or a check. A reception in the Gathering Place is also planned after the 7 pm talk.



Caring Tip from Stephen Ministries

A Compassionate Approach to Valentine's Day

For some people, Valentine's Day is about celebrating a loving relationship or enjoying lighthearted times with friends and family. But for those grieving the loss of a spouse, dealing with a divorce or break-up, facing a long-term separation, or otherwise feeling alone, this usually sweet holiday can have a bitter taste.

Here are a few tips for reaching out with care to someone who is struggling this Valentine's Day:



Listen between the lines. If someone makes a comment about Valentine's Day that hints at feelings of sadness or negativity, gently and nonjudgmentally follow up. A simple "Tell me more about that" lets them know you're willing to listen.



Treat the person's feelings seriously. People may experience a variety of difficult emotions on Valentine's Day. Treating their feelings as valid gives them permission to share whatever they need and want to share.



Avoid clichés. There are plenty of clichés about Valentine's Day, so be on guard. Saying something like "God has someone for you" or "You'll find another" will likely only add to their difficult feelings about the holiday.



Don't pressure someone to "cheer up." Trying to push someone to "get into the spirit of the holiday" often leaves them feeling worse and communicates that they shouldn't feel the way they do. Whether someone is sad or lonely, bitter or angry, a better approach is to be a caring, listening presence.

No matter the person's situation, your care can make a real difference. People may not think about those for whom Valentine's Day isn't a particularly happy time, so your willingness to relate with compassion may be a welcome surprise for someone expecting to suffer silently.

Fasting \'fa-stin\\

Refraining from food and drink for religious purposes. Biblically, it implied not eating or drinking from morning till evening.

The Catholic Church defines **fasting** as one full meal a day, with two additional breaks. Catholics observe a eucharistic **fast** and abstain from food and drink one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion. They also **fast** annually on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday if in good health and between the ages of 21 and 59.

WHY IT MATTERS

When we're self-sufficient, it's easy to forget that God is our ultimate source of life and hope. **Fasting** is a visceral reminder to trust in God. **Fasting** helps us to detach from worldly things not because they are bad but to remind us that God is the source of all gifts.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "Fasting and abstinence... help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart" (2043).

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Why do we fast?

Why **fast**? Our survival requires us to eat and drink. When we refrain from these most basic activities, it reminds us that "we do not live by bread alone." **Fasting** provides us with an opportunity to affirm our faith in God's providential care.

Fasting as a spiritual practice falls into the category of sacrifice. As in other acts of religious sacrifice, fasting takes something away from us. Fasting stirs us to contemplate justice—many in this world go without food—and motivates us to pray in a deeper, richer way. Because we don't want to do it, fasting is regarded as a penitential practice: We do it in reparation for sin, ours and the world's.

When you think of everything **fasting** can do—encourage fidelity and humility, awaken the spirit of justice, enhance prayer, assist those who are tempted—the question becomes: Why *not* **fast**?

The spirit of our fasting

Fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are ancient spiritual practices that foster humility and charity. In the words of fifthcentury Doctor of the Church Peter Chrysologus: "When you fast, see the fasting of others. If you want God to know you are hungry, know that another is hungry. If you hope for mercy, show mercy. If you look for kindness, show kindness. If you want to receive, give."

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

February 11, 2024 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. (Please don't tell anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, "If you will it, you can make me clean." At this, just before the healing, Jesus was "moved with compassion." The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it *feels like* to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will *feel what we are feeling*, and thereby heal us.
