Lenten Reflection

Second Sunday of Lent



All three readings from this Sunday give us a greatly expanded understanding of God's covenant with us. If you recall in last Sunday's first reading, God covenants with Noah that God will no longer destroy the earth by a flood. The floods cleansed the earth of sin. But Noah and those

on the Ark were a new start for the relationship between God and man.

Today we explore the relationship between God and Abraham. Abraham has a central role in Salvation history. In today's reading, Abraham shows he put God first even above his love for his son Isaac. This is a difficult reading for parents to understand. God never asks us to sacrifice our children to him. Is God asking Abraham to sacrifice Isaac? Or is God showing Abraham and Isaac, and therefore us, that faithful acceptance of God's will is rewarded.

Throughout Scripture, child sacrifice is a deeply sinful pagan practice. Whenever the Jewish people encounter a hostile people, child sacrifice is seen as a great evil of the pagans.

Abraham's willingness to sacrifice is a "type" that we will remember when we see Jesus, the Father's son, who offers himself for our sin. God is not asking us to sacrifice our children. But he is willing to give so much, even his son, for us.

The Covenant in some ways is now complete. God is not asking us to sacrifice our children. Instead, he covenants to offer his son as a sacrifice for our sin, for our salvation.

How do we respond to this gift of Divine Love? A good start is to recognize that we are just stewards of our families on behalf of God. We often struggle with how to put God first in our families. Work, illness, sports, and life can distract us. If we try to faithfully follow God's rules when our kids are young, examples of prayer and good works are relatively easy to establish. When kids become adults, those examples of faith are not always accepted. This can lead to great pain for parents. We need to accept that pain in love, never cutting off the relationship but always ready to accept your children as our Father has covenanted to accept us when we return to him.

The Eucharistic Miracles of the World is coming to Our Lady of the Wayside and can be seen in the Fr. Mackin Center from March 2 through March 5. The exhibit is a well-documented presentation of Eucharistic miracles that have taken place throughout the ages in various countries around the world. They are recognized by the Catholic Church as truly worthy of belief. The exhibit was created by **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, a 15-year-old Roman Catholic from Milan, Italy, who was beatified on October 10, 2020. It was his desire for the exhibit to draw others to love the Blessed Sacrament. The exhibit is

comprised of poster-size panels, each featuring a Eucharistic miracle with historic documentation, photos and illustrations. By means of the these panels, one can "virtually visit" places where the miracles took place.



Michael O'Neill, author, EWTN host, and creator of the popular miracle hunting website <u>MiracleHunter.com</u>, will talk about the Eucharistic Miracles on Tuesday, March 5 in the Church. RESOLVING CONFLICT



IN A RELATIONSHIP

Read below for tips on how to resolve conflict in a relationship in a healthy way!

TALK ONLY WHEN CALM

If you are still feeling upset about whatever caused the conflict, it is probably best to wait until you are both calm to be able to talk about the issue. If while you're talking, you feel yourself getting angry, take a break and use coping skills to calm down.

FOCUS ON FEELINGS

When you are talking to your partner, instead of blaming them, focus on telling them how their words or actions made you feel. Your partner should care about hurting your feelings. If you hurt their feelings at all during the conflict, make sure to apologize for doing so.

LISTEN

Conflict can only really be resolved if both people feel heard and are able to express how they are feeling to the other person. Make sure to give your partner the chance to feel heard by listening to what they have to say without interrupting. They should be able to do the same for you.

DON'T INVOLVE OTHERS

Conflict can best be handled if it is kept between you and your partner. Getting other people involved can only complicate the issue. If you are upset with your partner, only talk about it with close friends and family members if you need to. Make sure to stay off of social media and avoid making any passive-aggressive posts. It is always best to talk directly to the person you have conflict with.

RESOLVE THE ISSUE

Sometimes people deal with conflict by doing nothing and pretending that everything is OK. This is not a healthy way to resolve an issue. If your partner is doing something to make you feel anxious, sad, nervous, or upset, you should always *address* it with them. Resolving an issue means that both people have been able to express their feelings and committed on making changes to keep the conflict from happening again.

If you are in a relationship where you and your partner are regularly in conflict, be sure to talk to an adult to help you determine if this is a healthy relationship for you.

WORD OF THE WEEK

Agnus Dei \äg-nus-'dā\

Latin term for "Lamb of God." A title given to Jesus by John the Baptist (John 1:29); the litany sung or said by the assembly at Mass before Communion ("Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world...") introduced into the Roman Rite in the seventh century by Pope Sixtus; an image of a lamb often with a halo and a banner and cross used as a symbol of Christ; a wax disc sacramental.

CONTEXT

Either sin is with you, lying on your shoulders, or it is lying on Christ, the **Lamb of God** [Agnus Dei]. Now if it is lying on your back, you are lost; but if it is resting on Christ, you are free, and you will be saved. Choose what you want.

The address to the **Lamb of God** does not refer to Christ simply, but rather to Christ present in the Eucharist as a sacrificial offering.

WHY IT MATTERS

The Passover lamb is the symbol of God's people passing over from slavery and death to freedom and life (Exodus 12). A "lamb led to slaughter" is Isaiah's prophesy of God's faithful servant (Isaiah 53:70). The victorious Lamb in Revelation is the light of God's holy city (Revelation 21:9-22:5). With all of salvation history as its backdrop, the **Agnus Dei** epitomizes the sacrifice of Jesus who achieves our freedom from sin and death. "It is love to the end," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction (616).

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is the meaning of the Transfiguration?

Gospel Greek deliberately avoids the term *metamorphosis* in this account, an attempt to sever any "pagan" comparison. The brilliance of Jesus' face; the enveloping cloud, and Peter's suggestion of pitching tents evokes significant encounters Moses had with the Holy Presence. The simultaneous appearance of Moses and Elijah, representatives of Law and Prophecy, reinforce these anchors to the Hebrew story.

So what's it doing in the New Testament? Scholars offer three possibilities. One is that this event is the Gospel of Mark's misplaced Resurrection story. The second idea is that this story is a theological reflection of the first-generation church: a symbolic way of reconstructing what Jesus means to them. The third theory is that the Transfiguration is a private vision of Peter in which the truth about Jesus "came together" for him and shaped his understanding of the Second Coming before or even well after Easter. What's our final takeaway? Saint Paul declares that we will all be transfigured if we keep our sights trained on Christ.

For the love of God

One of the deepest spiritual longings is to know ourselves as the beloved of God. Maya Angelou, in her memoir *Wouldn't Take Nothing for My Journey Now*, recalls being asked by her teacher to read a section from a book that ended with the words, "God loves me." He instructed her to say the passage again and again. Eventually it dawned on her there might be truth in those words. "I suddenly began to cry at the grandness of it all," she writes. "I knew that if God loved me, then I could do wonderful things."

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

February 25, 2024 2nd Sunday of Lent

As a college student, my prized possession was an after-market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hard-earned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love — Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you." Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chaffs us that *God sets the terms* of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus — but that doesn't make it easy.
