Lenten Reflection Fourth Sunday of Lent



In this weekend's Gospel from John (for the normal cycle, not the Scrutinies) Jesus explains to Nicodemus that the Son of Man must be lifted up on a pole just as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent on a pole to heal the Israelites. They had sinned and, struck by poisonous snakes, were

dying. Moses carried this image of the bronze serpent on a pole throughout the Israelites' camp. Those who looked at the image in faith were healed from the deadly poison of the snake bite. Once again, God has given us a "Type" an event from the Old Testament that is similar to, or foreshadows, what Christ would do in his Passion journey to the Cross.

The serpent on the pole was a symbolic device that Moses used to cure people. The image of the snake was symbolic because the people were cured because they turned to observe the bronze serpent. It was their faith and God's grace that cured them not because the bronze serpent had some magic potion or power. The Israelites and the whole world would be saved by Christ's sacrifice if, again, we believe in and turn to God. Christ is offering us a healing treatment for sin, not a physical ailment.

Certainly, Christ performed many healing miracles. He cured people out of compassion and as proof that he was divine. Sometimes we become confused – you might even say desperate – when we or a loved one is sick, because we might demand a cure or try to bribe Christ to cure. We need to offer him faith, and perhaps the hardest part, accept whatever outcome that he gives us. Of course, God wants us to use whatever appropriate and ethical means are available.

Doctors and other healthcare workers wear a little "shield" as a sign of their healing vocation – a double serpent wrapped around a pole. This Caduceus comes from a symbol of the Greek god Hermes, and bears a striking resemblance to the staff Moses



carried with the bronze serpent. What is God trying to reveal to us about the interplay of science and faith?





WHY IT MATTERS

Venerable Fulton J. Sheen once divided the world into those who have found God and those who are still hungering, thirsting, and seeking. Religious practices in themselves may or may not bring a person to genuine holiness. But the life that exhibits true **joy** proves to be radiant with the life of God.

From *Gaudium et spes*, the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World: "The Lord is the goal of human history, the focal point of the longings of history and of civilization, the center of the human race, the **joy** of every heart and the answer to all its yearnings."

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Will my faith make me happy?

The biblical idea of happiness is linked to *beatitude* (Latin for "bliss"). Jesus offers beatitudes in his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's gospel. Often the primary word of each beatitude is translated as *blessed*. A more literal rendering might be the cry, "Happy you!" who are just, pure of heart, merciful, a peacemaker, and so on. God is the source of happiness, therefore doing as God does brings bliss.

So, the short answer to the question is, yes, living according to God's will makes you happy. It's the only thing, in fact, that does; or as Saint Thomas Aquinas declared, "God alone satisfies." Saint Paul lists **joy** as one of nine fruits of the Holy Spirit. Saint Francis de Sales went so far as to warn against giving in to excessive sadness as it's a counter-witness to the **joy** that comes in the life of faith.

Rejoice and be glad

Yet today is called Laetare ("rejoice") Sunday because even though it's Lent, the church urges us to cheer up in the words of Isaiah 66:10: "Rejoice with Jerusalem all you who love her." We may feel affection for the memory of biblical Jerusalem or concern for the current sorrows of the city. But it's the heavenly city, where justice and peace reign, that gives us reason to rejoice.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

March 10, 2024 4th Sunday of Lent

Our national pastime isn't baseball. It's what the Bible calls "condemning the world." We generally enjoy pronouncing curses upon those whom we see as trouble, wrong, or evil. Don't believe me? Listen to almost any podcast, cable news network, or social media platform to hear it. It will be some version of: "We all agree that if *they* are eradicated, things will be great." Condemning is almost always clothed in virtue. It basks in its good intentions. That's why it is so attractive. Condemning seems like our best path to saving what is good.

What a shock, then, to hear Jesus announce: **"For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn 3:17)**. He comes to save the world, as we all want, but he will accomplish it *without an act of condemnation*. How hard it is to accept this! Condemning feels godlike. I judge who and what must be lost to protect the good. But in the light of Jesus' endless mercy and love, this is the *least* godlike thing we can do.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to give up the delicious experience of condemning whomever in the world you most would like to see gone. Perhaps write down their names. Secondly, I invite you to consider fasting from any media that feeds the tasty but deadly tendency to condemn.
