Lenten Reflection

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

The name of this Sunday is *Palm Sunday of the Passion of Our Lord*. The name shows both the joy at Jesus coming into Jerusalem and into our hearts and also how he is rejected by the crowd and when we sin. This Sunday is both about the adulation and the hosannas, and the Passion of Jesus.

The first Gospel is proclaimed at the beginning of Mass from the entrance to the Church. The Gospel tells how the public greeted Jesus as he rode into the city. "Hosanna, hosanna in the highest!" Then at the altar and at the normal time of the Mass, the Gospel of the Passion is read. It is the longest Gospel of the year with multiple voices: Christ, the narrator, and the crowd.

This week is full of contrasts. Jesus knew the cheers would turn to jeers. Peter's boasting at the Last Supper and the disciples running away in panic are evidence of their surprise, or perhaps more accurately, their shock. At the procession, the welcome was consistent with the expectation that Jesus was the new king. The disciples, like many of us, did not understand the difference between the Kingdom of Israel and the Kingdom of God. Palm branches camouflaged the real issue — hardened and confused hearts.

When Jesus was providing miracles, bread and entertainment value, everyone was excited and would follow Him. But Jesus knew what would follow. He told the disciples and told us that he would be arrested and killed. Immediately before the Transfiguration when Christ predicted his death, in Matthew, Peter tries to talk Christ out of going to Jerusalem. In Luke, after the second prediction of his death, the disciples were confused.

Jesus was never confused. He knew what was in front of him and, as he paraded into Jerusalem, he knew some of the same people who were cheering would probably be calling for his death. That is what is so remarkable about Our Savior. He is a constant loving and merciful God who knows our weakness and responds with love. Let us spend this Holy Week in humble gratitude. When we are part of the crowd and call for his crucifixion during the Passion narrative, let us cringe at our sinfulness and cry for his mercy.







Still Feel Tired After Sleeping? This Might be Why

You already know that junk food can cause your health problems. But “junk sleep” is gaining popularity, and chances are you probably have experienced it yourself.

Junk sleep is a term used for sleep that does not result in feeling rested and is lacking quality. If you find yourself falling asleep with the TV on, overheating under the covers, snoring or experiencing joint pain, you may not feel as rested as the next day.

“Quality sleep is 7-9 hours long and leaves you feeling energized the next day,” says Dr. Yelena Tumashova, the director of sleep medicine at Advocate Health Care. “Sleep plays a vital role in keeping our entire body healthy and properly functioning.”

Some signs of inadequate sleep include:

- Feeling groggy after sleeping
- The inability to focus
- Feeling irritable
- Headaches
- Lack of motivation



To improve your sleep, Dr. Tumashova recommends:

- **Setting a consistent sleep schedule.** Try to wake up and go to bed at the same time each day.
- **Turn off your electronics prior to bedtime.** This includes TVs, laptops, smartphones and speakers.
- **Getting daily physical activity.** Exercise not only helps you fall asleep but also improves the quality of sleep.
- **Eating a balanced diet.** Avoid caffeine, alcohol and heavy meals before sleeping.
- **Setting your thermostat to your desired sleeping temperature.** The best temperature for sleeping is 65 degrees Fahrenheit, according to the National Sleep Foundation.
- **Limiting naps.** Napping later in the day can disrupt your REM cycle that night, increasing the chances of insomnia.
- **Trying relaxation techniques while falling asleep.** This is especially helpful for those who need help winding down and putting their worries at bay.

“We sleep about 30% of our lives, so if you are 30 years old, you have slept almost 10 years,” explains Dr. Tumashova. “Sleep is all about quality. Poor quality of sleep can be a result of untreated sleep apnea.”

If you have trouble sleeping, inform your primary care doctor so they can refer you to a sleep specialist for testing and treatment.

WORD OF THE WEEK

Prostration \pră-'strā-shən\

Lying face down in a ritual expressing humility, reverence, and submission. Used in the liturgy of ordination, it is also the posture assumed during the entrance ritual on Good Friday when priests and ministers proceed in silence and then reverence the altar before all assembled with a full **prostration**.

CONTEXT

Prostration can carry the symbolism of death—the death to self that comes before the candidate's rebirth into priestly service. —*Beafriar.org website*

[The Magi] saw the child with Mary his mother. They **prostrated** themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts.

—*Matthew 2:11*

In Hebrew the root of the word for “dismayed” can also mean “**prostrate**.” That's what dismay and fear do. They take the legs from under us.

WHY IT MATTERS

Postures are powerful. We say much without saying a word. Genuflection and kneeling demonstrate respect. The Asian kowtow—kneeling while touching forehead to the ground—is a deeper display of reverence. The rare full **prostration** symbolizes total submission to God alone. The ultimate **prostration** of Jesus on the cross brings about our salvation.

From the *Circular Letter Concerning the Preparation and Celebration of the Easter Feasts*: This act of **prostration** [on Good Friday], signifies both the abasement of “earthly man” and also the grief and sorrow of the Church.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is humility?

Humility is just about the exact opposite of everything you see in the world nowadays! To discover the essentials of humility, you have to experiment with self-emptying. Humility recognizes that everything comes from God and belongs to God. Therefore, to God alone go all praise, honor, and glory. When you begin with God and not with yourself, your perspective on reality does a dramatic shift. God's will comes first. “Not my will, but yours be done,” as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane.

When you choose the perspective of a humble heart, you become aware that your proper orientation as creatures should be one of obedience—that is, attentive listening—to God's call. It's precisely the attitude of obedience that led to the salvation of the world, as Saint Paul tells us: “[Jesus] humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.” Paul explains that humility means putting other people ahead of yourself, thinking of their needs rather than yours. That is so countercultural, jaws will drop whenever you attempt it.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

A few months before they married, my twenty-three-year-old sister and her fiancé planned a cross-country road trip to visit his family. My parents told them that they could only go if they slept in separate hotel rooms, offering to foot the bill. It might sound prudish, but my parents wanted the young couple to understand that their approaching unity was close, but not yet. Patience solidifies love.

What could this possibly have to do with Palm Sunday? It's usually overlooked, but the Gospels tell us that, after entering Jerusalem, Jesus **"looked around... and since it was late, went out to Bethany with the twelve"** (Mk 11:11) for the night. Who cares? Why include this detail? Jews in those days believed that the new Davidic King would one day re-enter and "marry" the city. A new future marked by fidelity would begin for God's people. Israel's God would be in union with His people forever. Without over-sexualizing the metaphor, perhaps Jesus refused to sleep in Jerusalem to remind us of his *marital* purpose. He was entering Jerusalem as the bridegroom-king. It was almost time, but not yet. Soon he will sleep in Jerusalem in the tomb and then something new will begin: his one body, his Church.

Lenten challenge: This Holy Week, I challenge you to keep this image in your mind all the way until Easter Sunday: Jesus is the faithful bridegroom who patiently prepares his bride for their new life together. Go to the Good Friday liturgy and kiss the cross. When you do, let that gesture be the long-awaited "I do" to our faithful God, who always waits for us.




