Speaking of lights. Did you notice that all the lights above the stations of the cross were glowing during stations of the cross this lent?

Oh, and have you noticed how much brighter the outside of all the buildings are these days?

No, I do not mean just the eternal equinox. We have upgraded all the lights on the outside of all the buildings including the church with higher output lumens. For example, the new fixtures on the middle school have gone from 3,000 lumens to 6,600 lumens. Best of all, these new brighter lights will cost the parish less to operate. Sometimes it is the little things that go unnoticed that can make a difference.

We also added another flood light on the top of the west end of the elementary school so there is no longer a dark spot as you pass between buildings.



#### **Reflection: Written in the Wounds**

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" — John 20:28






### Abiding in the One Who Dwells Within



### What You Need to Know About Measles



An increase in measles cases across the country and the globe has prompted the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to release an health advisory urging immunization.

Since January 1, the CDC has been notified of 58 confirmed measles cases and seven outbreaks in the U.S., 54 of which were linked to international travel. In 2023, the CDC was notified of 58 cases and four outbreaks. The advisory urges all U.S. residents traveling to ensure they are up to date on measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccination and recommends health care providers make sure pediatric patients are current on routine immunizations, including MMR. Additionally, the CDC is recommending all infants between ages 6-12 months who are traveling internationally receive an early MMR vaccine.

"A single dose of the MMR vaccine is 93 percent effective, and two doses are 97 percent effective in preventing measles, which means measles is almost entirely avoidable," explains Dr. Michael TeKippe, a pediatric infectious diseases physician at Advocate Children's Hospital. "The first dose is typically given between 12-15 months of age, and the second between 4-6 years of age. Unfortunately, in recent years, the percentage of U.S. kindergarteners vaccinated has dropped. This increases our chances of measles outbreaks and puts our entire community at risk."

The first symptoms of measles include high fever (typically between 102-105°F), cough, runny nose, and red, watery eyes. A day or two later, small, white dots known as Koplik spots may develop inside the mouth. The classic measles rash appears about three to four days after symptoms start. The fever and other symptoms typically last between 6 to 10 days.

Measles can be especially dangerous in children less than 1 year old and immunocompromised individuals. Severe complications of the illness include pneumonia, brain inflammation — known as encephalitis — and death.

"Measles is likely the most contagious disease we know, and it can spread rapidly," says Dr. TeKippe. "However, the measles vaccine is also the best vaccine we have and is very effective. Immunization can help protect you and your loved ones."

#### Annunciation \a-.nen-se-a-shan\

From Latin, "to bring news," the angelic proclamation to Mary of Nazareth that she would be the mother of Jesus. Mary's submission to this divine plan is simply given: "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Her "yes" is often referred to as Mary's *fiat* (Latin for "let it be done").

#### **WHY IT MATTERS**

Unlike many saving acts that are unilaterally achieved by the divine will, in the **Annunciation** a woman is invited to participate in the saving event that has consequences for all people and all time. Mary's yes is universal and limitless. At the **Annunciation**, Mary perfectly consents to God's will, then bears the Son, and is filled with the Spirit, which, as theologian Hans Urs von Balthasar notes, is wholly trinitarian.

From Pope Paul VI's *Marialis Cultus* ("Devotion to Mary"): [The **Annunciation** observance] was and is a joint one of Christ and of the Blessed Virgin: of the Word, who becomes Son of Mary, and of the Virgin, who becomes Mother of God.

#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

#### What do I need to know about Mary?

There is the biblical Mary of Nazareth, who fulfills Isaiah's Emmanuel prophecy by giving birth to a child who is "God with us." Her Magnificat canticle foreshadows Jesus' proclamation that the mighty will be brought down while the poor are lifted up. Mary plays other noteworthy roles: advocating for a miracle at Cana, being present at the cross, and participating in the Spirit's reception at Pentecost. Finally, as Mary is the first disciple of her son, she is the ideal model for all of us.

The church teaches four doctrines about Mary. Two declarations declare her a virgin as well as the Mother of God. Two later doctrines teach that Mary was conceived immaculately (sinless) and that, at the point of death, was assumed body and soul to heaven.

Devotionally, Mary plays a large role in popular piety. Her icon has been venerated since the early centuries in the East. By means of the Rosary, litanies, and pilgrimage, people of many lands feel a special closeness to the mother of Jesus who is mother to all.

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do you get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.
