You Spoke, We Heard You!



In the spring of 2023, as we were emerging from COVID, the Archdiocese of Chicago initiated the **Disciple Maker Index Survey**. It was designed to provide parishes with insights on how they were performing, where parishioners were on their spiritual journeys, as well as the parish's effectiveness in supporting them. Late last fall we received the Arch's data tabulations. There was a wealth of information to sift through and glean take-aways from. Nearly half (49%) of our regular mass attendees completed the survey. Thank you! Your voices provided important feedback and direction that will help shape our parish's future planning and development. A deep dive into the data revealed key learnings (listed below), which will help guide our next chapter at OLW. Stay tuned as we continue to communicate how your input will manifest itself in the works and life of our parish, as we continue our journey *together*.

Spirit to Spirit

Talk to any couple who are devoted to one another. Ask them when they realized they were in love — call-me-in-a-crisis love, face-the-day-to-day-with-me love — and the answer will probably not be “When I realized he was only dating me to win a bet with his boss.”

If you know what movie that references, you and 12-year-old me would have been great friends.

Like any other self-respecting American tween of the early 2000s, I used to watch a lot of romantic comedies. I forget how old I was when I realized that romantic comedies are actually ... really boring. Not because they're about love — true love is *fascinating*. I could watch real-life people talk about who they love for *hours*.

Because when we say we love someone — truly love them — what we mean is we love their spirit. We love what they are. We love the qualities that escape description, the attributes we have to talk around or reduce to cliché in order to define. We cannot love a body alone. We cannot love a name or a reputation. We cannot love a story that we've built around a relationship.

To be in love with someone you need to know their spirit. Intimately. And that knowledge cannot help but change everything about you. It changes your goals, your understanding of the world. It changes the amount of courage you have to face the life ahead of you. It changes your ability to be who God wants you to be.

The disciples lived and ate and walked with Jesus for three whole years before they really knew his spirit. They didn't know it on Good Friday when they scattered and hid and wept. They didn't know it on Easter Sunday, when they couldn't believe what they saw. They thought they loved him, but when push came to shove their love failed.

But by the end of their lives, the disciples knew the kind of love that sustained them even in the face of martyrdom.

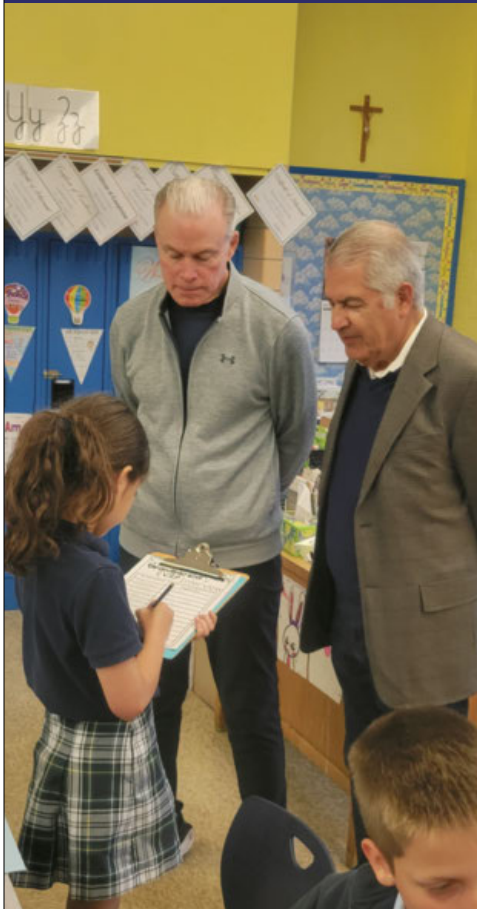
What was it that changed? It was the Spirit. They finally knew the Spirit.

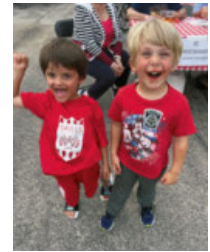

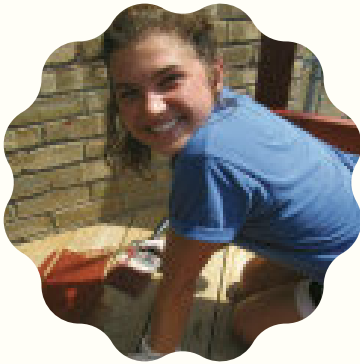

Protect Yourself From 3 Common Skin Cancers

Protecting your skin from the sun is something to stay on top of all year long, not just in summer. While taking care of your skin may seem like only a cosmetic concern, it goes a lot deeper than that.

“The rays from the sun give off several different types of ultraviolet rays like UVA, UVB and UVC,” says Dr. Peter Knabel, a dermatologist at Aurora Health Care. “These ultraviolet rays can be harmful to our skin and can cause skin aging, sunburns and skin cancer.”

Not all skin cancers are the same. Basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma and melanoma are three different, yet common types of skin cancer.

Basal cell carcinoma

Basal cells are in the lower part of the skin's top layer. One of the more common skin cancer types, basal cell carcinoma, is when skin cancer forms in this layer. It is the most common and least aggressive form of skin cancer followed by squamous cell carcinoma. It often grows more slowly and develops in areas susceptible to the sun, like the head, neck and face. Keep an eye out for patches that might look like a scar or an itchy, red raised area of skin.

Squamous cell carcinoma

Squamous cells are in the upper part of the skin's top layer, and when skin cancer forms here, it is called squamous cell carcinoma. Like basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma often can form on areas that are exposed to the sun, like your face, neck and lips. It can often look like a red, scaly patch, an open sore, or a brown spot like an age spot.

Melanoma

Melanoma forms in skin cells that produce melanin, which regulates skin pigmentation. It's the most aggressive form of skin cancer and is a major concern with its high risk of spreading. It most frequently develops on the neck, face, chest, back, and legs. A possible sign of melanoma can be a newly formed spot or one that is changing in appearance.

Dr. Knabel offers these tips for protecting your skin from these types of skin cancer:

- **Avoid direct sunlight:** Avoid direct sunlight for long periods of time, especially midday hours.
- **Wear sunscreen:** It's important to wear sunscreen daily to protect your skin, but this is especially true when spending time in the sun. Reapply every 1-2 hours for maximum protection, particularly when sweating or swimming. Don't forget sunscreen lip balm to protect your lips as well.
- **Wear a hat outside:** A wide brimmed hat can protect the front and side of your face, scalp and ears.
- **Self-skin exams:** Check yourself monthly for any new or changing brown or black moles. If its appearance changes, you should get it checked by your primary care physician or dermatologist.

WHY IT MATTERS

Lumen Gentium made Vatican II truly the "council of the Church about the Church," as theologian Hermann Pottmeyer notes. *Lumen Gentium* reinstated a vital truth, obscured by the 16th-century Protestant Reformation, that the church, and all its members, exists for the sake of the world and not to defend itself from the world.

From *Lumen Gentium*: Christ made the laity his witnesses and gave them understanding of the faith. It remains for each to cooperate in the external spread and dynamic growth of the Kingdom of Christ in the world. Therefore, let the laity devotedly strive to acquire a more profound grasp of revealed truth, and insistently beg of God the gift of wisdom (35).

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

How many feast days does Mary have?

At present, the Roman calendar commemorates 15 Mary days. Marian feasts accumulated through the centuries. They began to surface after the Council of Ephesus (431) bestowed the title "God-bearer" (*Theotokos*) on the mother of Jesus.

Four Marian celebrations are solemnities, the highest commemoration of the liturgical year: Mary, Mother of God (Jan. 1), Annunciation (March 25), Assumption (Aug. 15), and Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8). Three are feasts: Presentation of the Lord (Feb. 2), Visitation (May 31), and Birth of Mary (Sept. 8). Four are memorials, a simpler remembrance: Queenship of Mary (Aug. 22), Our Lady of Sorrows (Sept. 15), Our Lady of the Rosary (Oct. 7), and Presentation of Mary (Nov. 21). Four are optional memorials: Our Lady of Lourdes (Feb. 11), Immaculate Heart of Mary (second Saturday after Pentecost), Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (July 16), and Dedication of St. Mary Major Basilica (Aug. 5). The U.S. Bishops celebrate a 16th memorial for Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec. 12).

Pentecost Sunday

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

Aren't we longing to experience the Holy Spirit in a fresh way? Today we celebrate this untiring flame, once ignited on earth and burning still. So, we humbly cry out: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love! — *Father John Muir ©LPi*

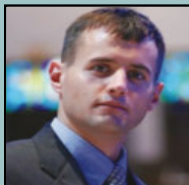

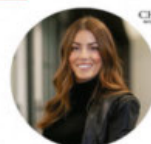
