Living Parables

Whenever someone begins a sentence with, "This parable means..." I roll my eyes. (Sometimes I do this inwardly, to be polite. But I still do it.)

We have a tendency to treat the parables like our mom's favorite casserole

recipe. Ah yes, we think as we sit down to dinner, smiling as we inhale the aroma of childhood. Good ol' mushychicken-rice-thing. I recognize you. I know exactly what you are. I don't even have to think about you.

Parables are often presented as an example of how God stoops to meet the limits of human understanding: truth, but in a cute little story! And while it's certainly true that the parables of Christ — each word, each detail, each character — are painstakingly crafted to suit the imagination and intelligence of man, we need to be careful how we think about that.

Sometimes we have a tendency to think of parables as simple and formulaic. We consign them to the genre of bedtime stories, whose point is to soothe, to lull. But these are stories that are meant to keep us awake. They are meant to keep us wondering.

When Christ spoke of the mustard seed, he was speaking the truth in words that his disciples needed to hear two thousand years ago. But he was also speaking to you today. And he was speaking to you tomorrow, and next year, and three years from now, and on your deathbed. If you read this parable on each of those occasions, you will hear something different each time. The parable, you see, is something alive.


It doesn't change, exactly, because the truth never changes. But people change, and what they need to hear changes too.

Don't ever make the mistake of thinking you can finish Jesus' sentences.





6 Ways to Master Healthy Grilling

Many Americans will be cooking outdoors as the weather heats up and with that comes a few health concerns, including foodborne illnesses.

According to Barbara Melendi, a dietitian at Advocate Health Care, there are six things you can do to make sure you get that grilled taste of summer while still staying healthy.

1. Marinate meats

Marinating your meat is not only tasty, but also good for your health, too. Marinating your steak can reduce the number of carcinogenic compounds, chemicals formed when meat is charred. Homemade marinades with spices, like rosemary and thyme, are easy and allow you to control the amount of sodium and sugar they contain. Plus, these spices contain natural antioxidants, which boost your immune system and combat the cancer-causing carcinogens in the meat.



2. Lower the heat

Using a slow burn on low heat will avoid charring your grilled foods. Though many say the charring adds flavor, the burnt portions

contain carcinogens and other compounds that could lead to cancer down the road. In this case, you want to avoid the burn. If you do happen to burn a bit around the edges, she advises trimming that portion before eating.

3. Keep it lean

Be sure to choose lean meats, like ground chuck hamburger, steaks with "loin" in the name and low-fat ground turkey breast. Plant-based burgers are also a great option.

4. Get the red out

Grilling doesn't mean you have to be eating red meats, which many studies have linked to heart disease and increased cancer risk. Add color besides red to your grill by throwing on fish or vegetables, like mushrooms, zucchini, tomatoes, onions and eggplant. Fruits, like apples, pears and even bananas, are great on the grill.

5. Keep an eye on the sides

Just because it's called a "salad" doesn't mean it's healthy. Avoid the mayonnaise-based side dishes, like potato salad, macaroni salad and even coleslaw, which are tasty, but are usually high in fat and calories. She advises opting for a fresh berry or garden salad, baked chips, cut up veggies with yogurt-based dips and vinaigrette dressings.

6. Choose your condiments wisely

People don't usually even think about some of the things they throw on a burger that can add calories and fat. Instead of cheese, try a slice of avocado. And, as alternatives to ketchup and mayonnaise, she suggests trying salsa for extra veggies and spice, as well as mustard for healthy flavor. Whole wheat buns are a great option for extra fiber.

All in all, Melendi says to enjoy your summer grilling, but choose your foods carefully and try some new, healthy choices.

"And don't forget to clean your grill each time you use it," she says. "This will further reduce your exposure to cancer-causing carcinogens that build up on the grill over time and can contaminate your healthy food choices."

The **kingdom of God** is where our best dreams come from and our truest prayers. We glimpse it at those moments when we find ourselves being better than we are and wiser than we know.

WHY IT MATTERS

Ancient Israel held hope in an eternal and universal restoration of the kingship of David. Mark, Matthew, and Luke all emphasize the **Kingdom's** arrival as the principal teaching of Jesus. Jesus proclaims the **Kingdom** in his preaching and in forgiving sins, casting out demons, and restoring the dead to life. Signs of the **Kingdom** include restored vision, hearing, mobility, good news for the poor, and much more. The **Kingdom** requires believers to be fully free, alert, and ready to move at the Spirit's prompting.

From *Gaudium et Spes* (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World): "After we have obeyed the Lord, and in his Spirit nurtured the values of human dignity, brotherhood, and freedom, we will find them again when Christ hands over to the Father 'a **Kingdom** of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice, love and peace.' On this earth that **Kingdom** is already present in mystery. When the Lord returns it will be brought into full flower."

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What does "Kingdom of God" mean?

The **kingdom of God** isn't "heaven"—that is, it's not where we go when we die. It's not even a place. **Kingdom** refers to God's rule. Jesus refers to the **Kingdom** as "among" us and "within" us—always within reach. We don't "get there" so much as abide in it where we are. We participate in the **Kingdom** in various ways: changing our hearts, working toward justice, protecting the vulnerable, and freeing the burdened. We pray for the **Kingdom** to come in the Lord's Prayer.

Jesus offers stories and metaphors for understanding the **Kingdom**: a sower, a mustard seed, a treasure, a banquet. Matthew's gospel references the **Kingdom** almost 50 times. John's gospel makes clear that the **Kingdom** isn't territory to be gained. It's where peace rules and oppression ends. No political system or social program can establish God's rule. We can't make "**Kingdom** come" by our own efforts. Yet we're summoned to enter more fully into the **Kingdom** by reshaping society to conform to its values.

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (JUNE 16)

How the mustard seed has spiced up spiritual life

The tiny mustard seed adds flavor not only to a lot of foods but also to a number of religious stories. We are familiar with the gospel parable of the mustard seed, which Jesus used as a model for the **kingdom of God**. To teach humility Jewish texts compared the knowable universe to the size of a mustard seed. And the Quran states that no soul will suffer the least injustice on the Day of Judgment because even the equivalent of a mustard seed will be accounted for on God's scales of justice.

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

June 16, 2024

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

My mother and father fell in love with each other rather quickly. It was only a span of two months between their first meeting and quiet betrothal. They waited for a significant period of time before going public with the happy news. It simply wasn't time. Love's strength and speed can sprout scandal in public. Until the big reveal, they gave the outside world only little hints, gestures, and riddles.

Something like this — but even more wonderful — is at play when Mark says of Jesus, "he did not speak to them without a parable, but to his disciples in private he explained everything." Jesus is the long-awaited messiah-king, but his identity as the Lord and Son of God is so new, surprising, and scandalous to human ears that the big reveal would have to wait. Thus, his parables are riddles, meant to conceal more than reveal. Even the disciples — who hear things explained directly — barely grasp what he is up to. It's only at the cross that Jesus' love for Israel and the world is explicitly revealed. Until then, much stays hidden and comes in riddles.

So it goes with us, too. I wonder at times why doesn't the Lord just speak to us directly in prayer about what we should do, or how to fix our problems. Or why doesn't he reveal himself directly to powerful leaders who are slow to act? Why does he allow life so often to be confounding, contradictory, and crazy? Because it simply isn't time yet. One glorious day, it will be. Until then, he teaches us in riddles, and only sometimes explains them.
