

Dear OLW Parish Community,

It is difficult to find the words to express my feelings as my time at OLW comes to an end. When I first accepted the position of principal at OLW in 2009, I never imagined I would remain in that position for 15 years. Yet, those 15 years have passed quickly. While my first years were consumed with navigating the school during a recession, and my later years involved leading a school through a global pandemic, I leave with many fond memories such as the school being awarded the National Blue Ribbon in 2015.

When I look around the school today, I am reminded of how much it and the field of education have changed in such a short time. There was no full-time preschool at OLW when I began. Now I leave with three filled full-day preschool classrooms. In 2009, the school only had two recently installed SMART Boards and two small computer labs. Each lab had only enough desktops to serve 15 students at a time. Now every classroom has an updated SMART Board and every student in K-8 has access to their own iPad during the school day. In an area with a strong public school district and other strong Catholic schools, I am proud that OLW has continued to adapt its curriculum and services so that it remains academically competitive. It is a school where its graduates can be confident they are prepared for high school and beyond. It has been my privilege to watch hundreds of amazing students graduate from 8th grade over the past 15 years.

While some things have changed, there are many things that remain the same. OLW has always been filled with so many dedicated teachers - teachers that remain committed to the school and its students year after year. While I am sad to say goodbye to them, I know they will continue to carry on the mission of the school long after I am gone. Over the years, the teachers and staff have always challenged me to be my best and pushed me to be a better leader.

Additionally, I am so thankful for all the families that have shown their support for me and the school throughout my time at OLW. Thank you to all of the families that have chosen OLW school over the years and placed their faith in me as principal. I hope I didn't let you down.

Finally, I want to say thank you to every parishioner that has supported the school in one way or another over the years. The school is an important ministry of the parish, and it relies on everyone to succeed in its mission of Enriching Minds, Fostering Faith, and Expanding Talents. The school has grown stronger because of the support of this great parish.

While I will deeply miss the OLW community, I feel strongly that now is the time for me to step aside and allow for a new era of leadership to be ushered into the school. I am thrilled that Matt Martino has been selected to serve as the new principal. When I look at Matt, I am reminded of myself in my first few years as principal. I have no doubt that his energy, commitment to Catholic education, and overall love for OLW will help him to carry on the school's mission. I am confident he will build upon the great things that currently exist and find new opportunities to help OLW expand and grow.

While I may no longer be the principal of Our Lady of the Wayside, I am proud to stand among the long list of individuals that have served as principal over its 70-year history.

### Shake Off the Dust

Our kitchen floor is at least 35 years old, and it's the ugliest color to come out of the '80s. But it's a good, durable floor, and my husband, bless his heart, guards it like it was a finely finished hardwood imported from Brazil.

Every time the kids track mud and sand across its vinyl surface, he immediately gets down on his hands and knees and lovingly wipes the mess away. I'm too impatient to do this myself — we have kids, so we're going to have a dirty floor, is my attitude. But this is the hill upon which my husband dies. On hands and knees, scraping dirt off an almost 40-year-old floor, he is the silent, long-suffering sentry, and if it kills him, he will keep these floors pristine. He is Gandalf, and the dirt is the Balrog. You shall not pass.

"Shake the dust off your feet." This is what Christ tells his disciples to do when they — and his word — are rejected. Shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them. Why does he say that? It's not an act of dismissal. It's not a thumbed nose or a stuck-out tongue. No, it's an act of caution: *Don't bring it with you. Leave it there*.

When we walk through the world, we pick up a lot of dirt. Misguided notions, disordered priorities, habits, and desires that we never noticed until we realized they left a trail. We come into a situation intending to do what is right, but somehow it all goes sideways, and we walk away from it with detritus clinging to us in places we don't notice. They wouldn't listen. They'll see, we think. Oh, they'll see. They'll see how right I was. Pride and vengeance hitch a ride on the soles of our feet, and we track them all through the world.

What to do about this? You can be like me with my ugly old floor. You can shrug your shoulders and say, "It happens, I guess. I'm only human. I meant well."

But here's what would be better: be like my husband. Get down on your knees and get rid of the dirt. Stop the trail in its tracks.

Dear OLW Parishioners,

Happy New Year! You read that correctly. July 1st marked the new fiscal year at Our Lady of the Wayside and across the Archdiocese. After hours of calculations, deliberations and number crunching we managed to produce a **balanced parish budget** which was blessed by Fr. Arthur, approved by the Finance Council and accepted by the Archdiocese.

To accomplish balancing the budget, we have a very significant 'ask' of you, our faithful parishioners. We are asking for each family to increase their weekly offering by \$6.

Our parish has approximately 2,050 registered families – 1,000 of which actively support the parish via weekly envelopes or online giving. If all 2,050 families contributed an additional \$6 per week, the parish would net a \$639,600 gain, resulting in a surplus of \$315,000 – money we would invest and use for future needs. If only the current 1,000 families that support our parish increase their offering, the parish would see an **increase of \$312,000**, the **exact amount** we need to balance the budget. If you are not contributing presently, we would be most grateful if you would begin to do so. **Our parish needs your support**. If you are one of the special 1,000 who give regularly, we thank you for your continued generosity.

We are living in a time of rising prices – everything we need to efficiently operate the parish is increasing. The Parish's only true source of income is the Sunday offerings made by you our faithful parishioners.

Over the last six months I, along with OLW's Finance Council, have advised Fr. Arthur on the best ways to most efficiently utilize our funds. The cost of day-to-day operations is increasing and we have challenges ahead. Special projects like the middle school bathroom renovations, windows in rectory, raising of sidewalks and church doors are costing more than originally budgeted – and the 'to do' list is **growing**. For example, the nine (circa 1950s) bathrooms in the grade school need renovation and our parking lot needs updating and stone repairs. Based on parishioner feedback (many shared they appreciate the improvements we are making), Our Lady of the Wayside is headed in a positive direction.

Taking all of this into account, I believe **YOU**, the parishioners of Our Lady of the Wayside, will step up and support us in our quest. **Is it not worth \$6 more a week to continue to see our parish grow?** 

Thank you for your ongoing and increased support of our Parish.

## Mission Co-Op Weekend, July 20-21

## (Archdiocese of Imphal)

The mission diocese of Imphal in the State of Manipur in Northeast India is home to 34 indigenous tribes of Mongolian origin. Since first Catholic baptism in 1952, Catholic population has grown up to 1, 01283 as of now. The diocese has 45 parishes, 8 Mission Centers and 174 priests, including 114 indigenous tribal priests. The growth of the Church has always been accompanied by various challenges and persecutions during the past decades. Between1990 - 2001, six of our young and dynamic missionaries were killed for witnessing the gospel. Yet the Church in Manipur is growing and blessed with lots of vocations to priesthood and religious life.





As we were making phenomenal progress in the field of evangelization, the State of Manipur witnessed the worst ethnic and religious persecution against the Christian minorities on May 3, 2023 which was unprecedented in the history of the Church in Manipur. The violence erupted in the form of burning of tribal villages and unprovoked shooting resulted in the killing of over 500 innocent Christians, including women and children. Nearly 70,000 fled their villages as most of their homes are completely burnt down and they have taken refuge in military camps and school buildings run by the churches. 248 Churches including five Catholic churches, rectories, schools, hostels and convents were vandalized and torched, causing widespread damages to properties worth millions of dollars. Presently church service is conducted in temporary sheds and school

buildings. It will take several years to rebuild

the churches and all our institutions. Our immediate concern, however, is to alleviate people's sufferings through massive relief program and also to provide at least 500 low cost houses to the most affected families. Each house will cost \$6500. We have confidence in the resilience of our communities and the strength of their faith. We need your prayers and generous help to provide the much needed relief and build permanent homes to the suffering people in the archdiocese of Imphal.



## Chairman's Statement on *Dobbs* Anniversary USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities

On June 24, 2024, we celebrate the second anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, ending the tragic reign of *Roe v. Wade*. It is a day for thanksgiving to God for answering our prayers and blessing the many years of hard work. This anniversary calls us to reflect on where we have been and where we are going.

The reversal of *Roe v. Wade* brought new opportunities to protect innocent human life. While some states have done this, others have enacted extreme abortion policies. Children have been left vulnerable to abortion until the moment of birth. Kansas, Michigan, and Ohio drastically expanded access to abortion. This fall, as many as ten additional states will have abortion referenda on their ballots, allowing voters to enshrine "abortion rights" and override existing pro-life safeguards.

At the same time, Congress has been promoting many pro-abortion policies while largely ignoring our calls to prioritize maternal health and support for children and families in need. In the spirit of faithful citizenship, I urge Catholics to engage their elected officials on all issues endangering life.

As we navigate this shifting political landscape, I cannot help but think the Holy Spirit has inspired our National Eucharistic Revival for such a time as this. Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist has the power to transform our own hearts and the heart of our culture. Even now, Catholics across the country are processing with Christ in the Eucharist from city to city, with their journeys culminating in the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.

Strengthened by our Eucharistic Lord, each of us must rededicate ourselves to serving the cause of life. May our Catholic parishes continue to welcome, embrace, and accompany women facing unexpected or challenging pregnancies, offering material, emotional, and spiritual support. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the countless individual Catholics who have dedicated themselves to parish and community initiatives, like Walking with Moms in Need.

May we never tire of sharing Christ's message of mercy with all who are suffering in the aftermath of an abortion. The Church continually offers hope and healing to women and men through ministries like <u>Project Rachel</u>.

I invite you to join a growing community of Catholics who have subscribed to Respect Life *Prayer and Action*. When you sign up, you will receive prayers, alerts to contact Congress and government leaders on important legislation, and ways to strengthen a culture of life in your community. Jesus tells us: "I came so that they might have *life* and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). I pray we will be united in our efforts to protect God's gift of life, in every stage and circumstance. Let us draw strength from our communion in the Body and Blood of Christ our Savior.



## These Summer Toys May Be More Dangerous Than You Think



The days are longer. You're looking for activities for your children to do during the day to get outside and have fun. But just how safe are some of these common summer toys?

"Unfortunately, many summer toys can be dangerous for children of all ages," says Dr. Nina Muhammad, an emergency medicine physician at Advocate Children's Hospital. "As the weather warms up every year, we see fractures on a daily basis, often from falls off of trampolines and monkey bars."

#### Dr. Muhammad weighs in on the safety of some of the most popular outdoor activities:

- Slip and slides: Neck and head injuries are a major concern with these, as most children tend to slide headfirst. Additionally, hazards like rocks and branches can be under or around the toy and lead to injuries. People may not realize the water that collects in these slides can pose a drowning risk, as well.
- Water balloons: Depending on the force and location on the body at which a child or adult is hit with a water balloon, serious injury can occur. Injuries to the eyes are not uncommon. Balloons also pose a suffocation risk, as they can be accidentally inhaled and can completely block the airway.
- Water beads: Also, sometimes referred to as sensory beads, water beads have been ingested by many children. These dangerous toys start out small but are superabsorbent and can grow up to 1,500 of their original size. When swallowed, they can continue to grow and lead to deadly blockages. And because of their makeup, water beads are not always easy to detect in imaging.
- **Trampolines:** Trampolines are a major cause of broken bones and head and neck injuries. While you may think they are simply not for young children, as children get older, they tend to try flips and tricks on trampolines and can wind up with severe spine and head injuries.
- **Bounce houses:** This is a big summer activity that leads to emergency room visits. Injuries from bounce houses tend to be like those from trampolines. With both toys, there is the risk of multiple children being hurt from jumping or falling on one another.

Dr. Muhammad says parents can mitigate some risk by incorporating certain safety features.

"Using a trampoline net or clearing the surrounding area of a slip and slide can make a difference, but at the end of the day, constant supervision is critical. We need to monitor what our children are playing with – and how they are playing."

The most severe summer injury she sees?

"Drownings. I cannot adequately express just how critical both water safety and constant supervision is of children around any body of water."

#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

#### What does the Bible say about discipleship?

A **disciple** is a student, from the Latin *discipulus*. In ancient times **disciples** lived with their teachers, listening to their words and imitating their actions. The intention was for a progression between the roles of student and instructor with **disciples** eventually becoming rabbis or prophets themselves. It was irregular for Jesus to make permanent **disciples** of his followers. "You have only one teacher and father in heaven," he told them. Another distinguishing feature of Jesus' school is that he chose his **disciples**, not the other way around.

The most intriguing part of Jesus' call to **discipleship** is that it took place in ordinary contexts, such as a fisherman's workday, not in a religious setting like a synagogue. **Discipleship** then deepened "along the way" with Jesus.

#### Discipleship explained

Like Saint Francis of Assisi, founder of his order, 13th-century Franciscan Saint Bonaventure saw in all creation vestiges of God and believed that through created things God speaks: "Every creature is a divine word because it proclaims God." In the search for knowledge, he encouraged humility: "If you desire to know, ask for grace, not instruction." And "in your deeds and words look upon Jesus as your model."

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION:

#### July 14, 2024

#### 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Once I asked a fallen-away Catholic friend of mine what he remembered about the parish priest from his youth. He said, "He was a gentle, nice guy. Kind of vanilla. Kept to himself." It struck me that he, perhaps like many, perceive Catholic priests as the following: lonely, harmless, and self-sufficient. As a challenge both to this perception (accurate or not) and to us priests who perhaps feel a pull in that uninspiring direction, stands the mighty image of what we see in the Gospel this Sunday.

Jesus sent out his apostles, "two-by-two, with power over demons, and without money belts." Two-by-two: they enjoyed deep fellowship and brotherhood. Power over demons: they were anything but harmless. These men wielded enormous power against evil. Without money belts: they were not self-sufficient. They needed others to help them. Not lonely, but in community. Not harmless but armed with massive spiritual energy. Not self-sufficient, but poor and in need of help.

This is a challenge to me, and perhaps to all of us, living in a rich, secularized, and individualized culture. Do I embrace my priestly ministry in deep fellowship with other priests? Do I speak and act boldly to drive out evil where it is found? Do I live poorly and simply, trusting in the help of those around me even for basic needs? The fruitfulness of priestly ministry largely depends on these three traits. Let's pray for all priests — and, by extension, all of us Christians — to live more like Jesus' communal, poor, and powerful apostles.


