

# The Spirit of the Gospel: Love

# 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Each religion has something that it is proud of. The Egyptians had the great traditions regarding how to regulate the Nile River, how to build the pyramids and the graves of their Pharaohs. They had special methods for mummifying their kings, the bodies of whom have lasted until today.

The people of ancient Greece were proud of the wisdom of their philosophers, great thinkers, and mathematicians. They built special temples and monuments dedicated to the gods they had created gods like Zeus, Athena, Aphrodite, who were based on humans. They wrote great dramas and devised special myths to explain things in the world, and the gods were often the protagonists in these myths.

The ancient Israelites received a special gift from God—the true God: the law. God gave the Israelites the law as a sign of His Love and care. For by following

God's law, the Israelites would be able to come to know Him in a deeper way. Even more, not only did God give the law, He Himself fulfilled it. Through the Incarnation, Jesus Christ fulfilled the law.

In today's Gospel we hear a discussion between Jesus and the Pharisees. This discussion pertains to God's law, specifically to purity. The Pharisees are perplexed by the lack of exterior purity of Jesus' disciples. The Pharisees and the scribes were good people, but for them it was most important to follow the letter of the law.

Jesus tells the Pharisees that there is something more important than the letter of the law—than exterior things—and that is the spirit of the law. As Jesus says, it is not what is on the exterior that is bad, but what comes from the interior—meaning what comes from the heart—that can be evil. For God, the most important is what we have in our hearts, our intentions. Even before Jesus, God made this clear through the prophets of the Old Testament. Many times, we hear the prophets encourage the people to change their lives and to turn their hearts to God. God wants us to love Him and others, because He loves us and wants to bestow His Love on us. To love God means to follow His commandments, but with a good intention and purity of heart.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks about interior things. Jesus speaks about the importance of having a purity of heart and good intentions in all that we think, say, and do.

During today's Eucharist let us not be afraid to be close to Jesus. He always reminds us that He loves us unconditionally, and He is always ready to give us the grace to follow Him:

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart . . ."






# FATHER DAHM TO PREACH ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE





# 6 Tips for Starting the School Year Successfully



For many children, the first day of school will be their first ever day of school. Others will head to a brand-new school. As a pediatrician, I'm often asked how to best prepare a child for this big life change. Here is my advice to make your child's start of the school year successful.

#### Prepare your child - and yourself

Talk about what a typical school day may look like as well as topics such as bigger classrooms, new teachers and friends, and scheduled activities/meals. If your child's school allows, visit the classroom and meet the teacher in advance. This can be especially helpful for children who don't attend daycare.

Make sure your child is getting good sleep. Families should have a bedtime routine that promotes good sleep hygiene.

#### Play it safe

Teach your child their phone number and home address. This becomes useful if they ever get lost or need to get picked up from school. Make sure their school knows the approved guardians for pickups and their contact information.

#### **Encourage independence**

When children learn independence, their confidence builds which makes new experiences seem less scary. Let your child put on their own jacket or shoes and practice potty routines.

#### **Start out strong**

Make sure you understand school policies. Are there uniforms? What school supplies does your child need? Should you be packing lunch? These preparations will ensure your child starts school with everything they need. Follow the American Academy of Pediatrics checklist for the first day of school.

#### Talk about the tough stuff

Kids often speak without filters and don't understand the negative impact words and actions can have. Teach your children how every child is special in their own wonderful way. Give positive reinforcement and praise for good behaviors and model kindness. If your child has experienced bullying, have a heart-to-heart conversation with them and remind them how much they are loved and of all the amazing qualities they have. Familiarize yourself with your child's school policies regarding bullying behaviors.

#### Keep drop off short and sweet

Sometimes saying goodbye is a difficult time for your child – and maybe you. The most effective way to address separation anxiety is to keep the drop off brief. Say goodbye, give your child a big hug and kiss, let them know you will be picking them up later and leave. The longer you stay while your child is upset or crying, the longer they will continue to cry. Once you leave, their teacher will help with comforting them and introducing your child to the many fun distractions in the classroom.

As the school year begins, take a deep breath and remain calm. Parents tend to be more nervous than their children, which can increase kids' anxiety. This is a big milestone to celebrate. Enjoy every moment of it. You've raised an amazing child. The best thing you can do is let them become independent while always being there with support and love.

Scientists have warned for decades that rampant misuse of the environment is causing a level of climate change that will alter the conditions of life on Earth. As oceans rise and weather becomes more extreme and erratic, we have run out of time and excuses for inaction.

From *Laudato si*': Now, faced as we are with global environmental deterioration, I wish to address every person living on this planet.... In this Encyclical, I would like to enter into dialogue with all people about our common home (3).

#### **QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

#### What do I need to know about Laudato si'?

Pope Francis' prophetic encyclical "On Care for Our Common Home" is a game-changer. This is no dry repetition of churchy ideas: God made the world, life is sacred, love your neighbor, please recycle. Instead, he presents a summons to the global conscience anchored in the language of science, economics, and social theory, cradled in scripture, prayer, and passionate moral appeal. The pope touches third-rail politics and tramples on toes, but who wants a pope who minces pieties or holds his tongue? As Saint Teresa of Ávila said: "The world is in flames! Let's not waste our prayer bothering God with trifles!"

The pope quotes voices seldom heard: fellow bishops from Canada, Japan, Paraguay, Bolivia, Portugal, New Zealand. He cites the Ecumenical Patriarch of the Orthodox Church along with the saints, quotes international conferences as well as examining sacramental realities. *Laudato si'* sounds the warning and points toward hope. If you're not stunned, breathless, and persuaded by this message, go back and read it again.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION:**

#### September 1, 2024

#### 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Purity isn't popular at the moment. Or is it? Look at a rack of health magazines or at popular podcasts. You'll see an infinite ocean of regulations and rituals of diets, intermittent fasting, morning sun rituals, intense juice detox practices, lists of dangerous foods, mental practices, as well as long lists of dos and don'ts for the proper cleaning of clothes, dishes, cars, houses, pets, and children. Like it or not, we long to be pure, clean, and without blemish.

This question of purity haunted people in Jesus' day, too. The Pharisees and scribes (the leading purity authorities of the day) criticize Jesus, asking, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" (Mark 7:5). Jesus responds by saying, "There is nothing outside the person that can defile him if it goes into him; but the things that come out of the person are what defile the person" (Mark 7:15). What does he mean, and how can it help us be pure?

We've probably all heard the somewhat shopworn interpretation that Jesus replaces the ritual, exterior notion of purity with a moral, interior one. Christianity is thus seen as a kind of moral re-tooling, as if religion doesn't make us pure. Good moral intentions do. But this doesn't take the rest of Jesus' ministry seriously enough, nor our obsession with purity. The better reading is that Jesus audaciously offers himself as the ultimate source of human purity — from within each human heart. Both our religious ritual practices and our moral actions are meant to flow from this encounter with Jesus the Lord. When we are in friendship with him, everything becomes pure for us.
