Christ's Kingship

Feast of Christ the King

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. In today's Gospel, Jesus is questioned by Pilate, who wants to know if Jesus is the King of the Jews. Jesus answers Pilate's question with the words: "My kingdom is not belonging to this world." If Jesus has a kingdom, then logically He must be a king. Yet, he is not

any ordinary King. Jesus is God. He is the Truth. And for this reason, He also tells Pilate: "For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

Pilate was not interested in whether or not Jesus was the King of the Jews. Nor was he interested in the truth that Jesus spoke. Pilate himself was a ruler with power, and Jesus posed no threat to his power. His did not belong to the world. At this point, we might ask ourselves, why does Jesus' Kingdom not belong to this world? Jesus' Kingdom does not belong to the world because the world is steeped in darkness and lies. The world is not interested in the truth, but in power and money. If Jesus' kingdom belonged to the world, we would have no reason to hope that something better than our present life exists—something that is eternal.

As this liturgical year comes to an end and the new liturgical year begins next Sunday with Advent, today's feast reminds us that we are made for something greater than this world. Jesus is the King of Heaven. This Great King also became a little, helpless child in the womb of Mary to bring light and hope into this dark world of suffering and sin. There is no coincidence, therefore, that when Jesus admits He is a King, He does so as He accepts the cross of suffering and death. There is no coincidence that when Jesus speaks about His Kingdom, a few hours later the world considers His life a complete failure. There is no coincidence because this, too, is our path. This too is what we experience if we follow the truth. We are called to imitate Christ the King, who became small, suffered, died on the Cross and rose from the dead so that we might be participate in His Kingdom. It is not possible to participate in Christ's Kingship without first following His example by carrying our daily crosses. It is not possible to rise from the dead, without first dying to ourselves.

Christ the King is a contradiction in the eyes of the world. In the eyes of we who believe, however, He is our everlasting hope that something greater than this dark world exists. May this truth stir your hearts to fight for the truth. And may it also be the source of your peace and tranquility.



Thanksgiving: The Wellness Ingredient


As Thanksgiving approaches, our thoughts turn to family gatherings, festive meals and autumn's splendor. But beyond the stuffing and pumpkin pie lies an opportunity to express gratitude and reap its abundant benefits for our wellbeing. This cherished American holiday invites us to pause and count our blessings, a practice that nourishes our bodies, minds and spirits.

The tradition of Thanksgiving traces back to the Pilgrims' celebration of their first successful harvest in the New World. They gathered to give thanks to God for His provision and protection through difficult times. Today, Thanksgiving continues as a time to express gratitude for life's gifts both big and small.

While gratitude has long been considered a virtue, modern research now reveals its power as a catalyst for wellness. A growing body of evidence shows that cultivating thankfulness yields a bounty of benefits for our whole person.

The life-extending effects of gratitude appear to stem from its wide-ranging impact on our wellbeing. Previous research has linked gratitude to an array of health benefits including:

- Improved cardiovascular health markers
- Enhanced immune function
- Better sleep quality
- Reduced inflammation
- Lower blood pressure
- Decreased depression and anxiety
- Greater resilience to stress



"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." – 1 Thessalonians 5:18

From a faith perspective, gratitude deepens our connection to God as the source of all blessings. Scripture repeatedly exhorts us to give thanks in all circumstances. Now science affirms the wisdom of this timeless counsel. When we are thankful, we align ourselves with God's design for human flourishing.

So how can we tap into gratitude's transformative power this Thanksgiving and beyond? Here are some practical ways to weave thankfulness into daily life:

- 1. Keep a gratitude journal, noting 3-5 things you're grateful for each day
- 2. Express appreciation to others through words, notes or small acts of kindness
- 3. Say grace before meals, savoring God's provision
- 4. Take a gratitude walk, noticing the beauty in nature
- 5. Reframe challenges by finding lessons or silver linings
- 6. Volunteer or donate to causes you care about

As you gather with loved ones this Thanksgiving, consider starting a tradition of sharing gratitude around the table. Invite each person to name something they're thankful for. Create a gratitude tree, writing blessings on paper leaves to hang on branches. Or simply take a quiet moment to breathe deeply and count your blessings.

By intentionally practicing gratitude, we open ourselves to receive the fullness of life. We train our hearts and minds to see abundance rather than scarcity. And we invite God's peace and joy to permeate our whole being.

WORD OF THE WEEK

Solemnity \sə-'lem-nə-tē\

From Latin *sollemnis* for "fixed ceremonial," highest-ranking day of the church calendar that celebrates a mystery of faith such as the Trinity, an event in the life of Jesus, Mary, the Mother of God, or another important saint. **Solemnities** override every other feast or memorial, including Sundays in Ordinary Time. The church assigns Sundays and **solemnities** three readings—from a prophet, apostle, and gospel—to instruct the faithful in the work of salvation.

WHY IT MATTERS

Celebration is a key aspect of what we do as social beings. Distinguishing the level of significance of each kind of gathering helps us to appreciate its value. We can't be present for every get-together. But surely some are not to be missed. In the life of the church, 24 days identified as **solemnities** are high-value events for people of faith.

From *The Liturgical Year & Calendar*. Saints and other celebrations are distinguished by importance. Sundays and **Solemnities** begin their celebration on the evening before, Feasts and Memorials are celebrated over the course of one day, and Memorials are either Obligatory or Optional.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Why do we have a feast called Christ the King?

Before Italy became a nation in the late 1800s, popes governed geographical territory (the papal states) for centuries. These were erased with the fall of Rome in 1870, leaving then-Pope Pius IX a prisoner of the Vatican. Four popes later, the "Italian Question" of what territory, if any, the church could claim remained unresolved. In 1922, with Mussolini in power, Pope Pius IX emerged on St. Peter Basilica's balcony to offer his first urbi et orbi ("to the city and to the world") address, the most solemn blessing of the church, which no pope had offered in 50 years. It signaled Pius XI's engagement in world affairs, and negotiations resulted in the Lateran pacts of 1929, defining the Holy See's independence from Italy and creating the tiny state of Vatican City. Celebrating the Solemnity of Christ as King further clarified the relationship between the church and temporal affairs. Though Mussolini, Stalin, and Hitler ascended to world domination in that generation, the throne of Christ superseded them all. Worldly princes have but a season of greatness. Christ reigns forever.

When Pope Pius XI established the feast of Christ the King in 1925, he wrote that "it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from Christ's empire." Jesus must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies. Whatever love and loyalty we have for our country, the values we ultimately choose to espouse must be those of the kingdom of God. The church is a global family that unites people beyond national borders. As Saint Paul reminds us in his Letter to the Philippians: "Our citizenship is in heaven."

GOSPEL MEDITATION:

November 24, 2024

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

When I was a young boy in Burlington, Vermont, my dad had a good friend named Phil who owned a sporting goods store. I loved sports, so meandering the treasure-filled aisles was an unmitigated joy. One afternoon, we were shopping for a baseball glove. Dad said to me, "Hey Johnny, see that man who just walked into the store? That's Phil." I remember being fascinated and a little terrified. I recall thinking, "That man right there is in charge of everything in this store!" He reigned over every ball, sneaker, jersey, and sweatsuit. Phil became a family friend. And he was a good owner. The store flourished, and I found myself even more at peace every time I went there. I felt a new hope and even responsibility for the store to flourish.

To say that Christ is the King of the Universe means that Jesus has absolute authority over everything in it. It should fill us with awe and fascination. He is in charge. The world and everything in it are finally his. Knowing that he knows and loves us should make us also feel a deep peace at being a part of his universe. This leads us to want his kingdom to flourish, to play some responsible role in it.

We advance his kingdom by promoting the truth. "Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice," Christ the King proclaims. In Phil's store, it was about the truth of athletics. In our world, it's all about the truth of all creation, especially the dignity of the human person, made by and for our loving God. Let's rejoice that we know the true king and commit to the flourishing of his kingdom.
